A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to certain persons' entitlement to public information.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 552.001(a), Government Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (a) Under the fundamental philosophy of the American
- 7 constitutional form of representative government that adheres to
- 8 the principle that government is the servant and not the master of
- 9 the people, it is the policy of this state that each person whose
- 10 primary residence is in this state is entitled, unless otherwise
- 11 expressly provided by law, at all times to complete information
- 12 about the affairs of government and the official acts of public
- 13 officials and employees. The people, in delegating authority, do
- 14 not give their public servants the right to decide what is good for
- 15 the people to know and what is not good for them to know. The people
- 16 insist on remaining informed so that they may retain control over
- 17 the instruments they have created. The provisions of this chapter
- 18 shall be liberally construed to implement this policy.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 552.021, Government Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- Sec. 552.021. AVAILABILITY OF PUBLIC INFORMATION. Public
- 22 information is available to any person whose primary residence is
- 23 in this state [the public] at a minimum during the normal business
- 24 hours of the governmental body.

- 1 SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 552, Government Code, is
- 2 amended by adding Section 552.030 to read as follows:
- 3 <u>Sec. 552.030.</u> REQUEST FOR INFORMATION FROM NONRESIDENT.
- 4 (a) If a governmental body receives a request for information from
- 5 a person whose primary residence is not in this state, the
- 6 governmental body may, but is not required to, accept or comply with
- 7 the request.
- 8 (b) A governmental body may ask a requestor to provide the
- 9 physical address at which the requestor resides in order to
- 10 establish the requestor's residency. If, not later than the 10th
- 11 business day following the date the governmental body's request is
- 12 sent to the requestor, the requestor fails to provide information
- 13 establishing residency in this state, the governmental body may,
- 14 for purposes of the request, treat the requestor as a person whose
- 15 primary residence is not in this state.
- SECTION 4. Section 552.221(a), Government Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 (a) An officer for public information of a governmental body
- 19 shall promptly produce public information for inspection,
- 20 duplication, or both on application by any person whose primary
- 21 <u>residence is in this state</u> to the officer. In this subsection,
- 22 "promptly" means as soon as possible under the circumstances, that
- 23 is, within a reasonable time, without delay.
- SECTION 5. Section 552.222(a), Government Code, is amended
- 25 to read as follows:
- 26 (a) The officer for public information and the officer's
- 27 agent may not make an inquiry of a requestor except:

- 1 (1) to establish proper identification;
- 2 (2) to confirm that the requestor's primary residence
- 3 <u>is in this state;</u> or
- 4 (3) [except] as provided by Subsection (b), (c), or
- 5 (c-1).
- 6 SECTION 6. Section 552.223, Government Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 552.223. UNIFORM TREATMENT OF REQUESTS FOR
- 9 INFORMATION. The officer for public information or the officer's
- 10 agent shall treat all requests for information from persons to whom
- 11 the officer is required to produce public information under Section
- 12 552.221(a) uniformly without regard to the position or occupation
- 13 of the requestor, the person on whose behalf the request is made, or
- 14 the status of the individual as a member of the media.
- 15 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 16 a request for public information made on or after the effective date
- 17 of this Act.
- SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
