23	Sec. 551.452. LICENSE PLATES FOR PACKAGE DELIVERY VEHICLES.
24	(a) The Texas Department of Motor Vehicles may issue

1	distinguishing license plates for a vehicle operated by a motor
2	carrier for the purpose of picking up and delivering mail, parcels,
3	and packages if the vehicle:
4	<u>(1) is:</u>
5	(A) an all-terrain vehicle;
6	(B) a golf cart;
7	(C) a neighborhood electric vehicle;
8	(D) a recreational off-highway vehicle; or
9	(E) a utility vehicle; and
10	(2) is equipped with headlamps, taillamps,

22	operate, for the purpose of picking up or delivering mail, parcels,
23	or packages, a vehicle bearing license plates issued under Section
24	551.452 on a public highway that is not an interstate or a
25	limited-access or controlled-access highway and that has a speed
26	limit of not more than 35 miles per hour.

H.B. No. 561 1 (a) In addition to the operation authorized by Sections 551.453 and 2 551.454, the governing body of a municipality may allow a motor carrier to operate, for the purpose of picking up or delivering 3 mail, parcels, or packages, a vehicle bearing license plates issued 4 5 under Section 551.452 on all or part of a public highway that: 6 (1) <u>is in the corporate boundaries</u> of the 7 municipality; and 8 (2) has a speed limit of not more than 35 miles per 9 hour. 10 (b) In addition to the operation authorized by Sections 551.453 and 551.454, a county commissioners court may allow a motor 11 12 carrier to operate, for the purpose of picking up or delivering mail, parcels, or packages, a vehicle bearing license plates issued 13 under Section 551.452 on all or part of a public highway that: 14 15 (1) is located in the unincorporated area of the 16 county; and 17 (2) has a speed limit of not more than 35 miles per 18 hour. 19 Sec. 551.456. CROSSING CERTAIN ROADWAYS. A vehicle bearing license plates issued under Section 551.452 may cross 20 intersections, including on or through a road or street that has a 21 22 speed limit of more than 35 miles per hour. Sec. 551.457. CONFLICTS. In the case of a conflict between 23 this subchapter and other law, including Chapters 502 and 663, this 24 25 subchapter controls. 26 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
