## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to certain leave policies for state employees. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 661.902(b), Government Code, is amended 4 5 to read as follows: 6 (b) The administrative head of an agency may determine that 7 a reason other than <u>a reason</u> [that] described by Subsection (a) is sufficient for granting emergency leave. Subject to the provisions 8 9 of this subsection, the administrative head [and] shall grant an emergency leave to an employee <u>if the employee requests the leave</u> 10

- and [who] the administrative head determines that the employee has 11 12 shown good cause for taking emergency leave. The administrative
- head may not grant an emergency leave to an employee under this 13 14 subsection unless the administrative head believes in good faith
- that the employee being granted the emergency leave intends to 15
- 16 return to the employee's position with the agency on expiration of
- the period of emergency leave. 17
- 18 SECTION 2. Subchapter Z, Chapter 661, Government Code, is 19 amended by adding Section 661.923 to read as follows:
- Sec. 661.923. LEAVE DURING AGENCY INVESTIGATION. (a) The 20
- 21 administrative head of an agency may grant leave without a
- deduction in salary to a state employee who is the subject of an 22
- 23 investigation being conducted by the agency.
- 24 (b) A state employee who is the subject of an investigation

- 1 being conducted by the employing agency is ineligible to receive
- 2 leave for that reason under any other provision of this subchapter.
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 661.902(b), Government Code, as amended
- 4 by this Act, and Section 661.923, Government Code, as added by this
- 5 Act, apply only to a grant of leave made on or after the effective
- 6 date of this Act. A grant of leave made before the effective date of
- 7 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date that leave was
- 8 granted, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
