## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the adoption of a physical fitness test by the Texas
- 3 Commission on Law Enforcement.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1701.306, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 by amending Subsections (a), (b), and (d) and adding Subsection
- 7 (a-1) to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The commission may not issue a license to a person
- 9 unless the person is examined by:
- 10 (1) a licensed psychologist or by a psychiatrist who
- 11 declares in writing that the person is in satisfactory
- 12 psychological and emotional health to serve as the type of officer
- 13 for which a license is sought; [and]
- 14 (2) a licensed physician who declares in writing that
- 15 the person does not show any trace of drug dependency or illegal
- 16 drug use after a blood test or other medical test; and
- 17 (3) a fitness examiner who declares in writing that
- 18 the person has successfully passed the physical fitness test
- 19 <u>adopted by the commission under Subsection (a-1)</u>.
- 20 <u>(a-1)</u> The commission shall adopt a physical fitness test
- 21 that has standards that are equivalent to the physical fitness
- 22 standards adopted by the Department of Public Safety under Section
- 23 614.172, Government Code.
- 24 (b) An agency hiring a person for whom a license is sought

- 1 shall select the examining physician, [and] the examining
- 2 psychologist or psychiatrist, and the fitness examiner. The agency
- 3 shall prepare a report of each declaration required by Subsection
- 4 (a) and shall maintain a copy of the report on file in a format
- 5 readily accessible to the commission. A declaration is not public
- 6 information.
- 7 (d) The commission may order an applicant to submit to an
- 8 examination described by Subsection (a) by a psychologist,
- 9 psychiatrist, [er] physician, or fitness examiner appointed by the
- 10 commission if the commission:
- 11 (1) has cause to believe that a law enforcement agency
- 12 failed to follow commission rules relating to an examination; or
- 13 (2) discovers that the applicant has submitted a false
- 14 declaration.
- SECTION 2. Section 1701.307(a), Occupations Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 (a) The commission shall issue an appropriate officer or
- 18 county jailer license to a person who, as required by this chapter:
- 19 (1) submits an application;
- 20 (2) completes the required training;
- 21 (3) passes the required examination;
- 22 (4) is declared to:
- 23 <u>(A)</u> be in satisfactory psychological and
- 24 emotional health and free from drug dependency or illegal drug use;
- 25 and
- 26 (B) have passed the physical fitness test adopted
- 27 by the commission under Section 1701.306(a-1); and

- 1 (5) demonstrates weapons proficiency.
- 2 SECTION 3. The heading of Subchapter H, Chapter 1701,
- 3 Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 4 SUBCHAPTER H. CONTINUING EDUCATION, REGULAR TESTING OF PHYSICAL
- 5 FITNESS, AND YEARLY WEAPONS PROFICIENCY
- 6 SECTION 4. Subchapter H, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 1701.3555 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 1701.3555. REGULAR TESTING OF PHYSICAL FITNESS. (a)
- 9 Each peace officer shall take the physical fitness test adopted by
- 10 the commission under Section 1701.306(a-1) in the manner and at
- 11 intervals prescribed by rules adopted by the commission.
- 12 (b) The commission by rule shall:
- 13 <u>(1) provide for waiver of the requirements of this</u>
- 14 section for an individual peace officer based on the facts and
- 15 circumstances of the individual case, including whether an officer
- 16 was injured in the line of duty; and
- 17 (2) adopt procedures to ensure timely and accurate
- 18 reporting by agencies and persons licensed under this chapter of
- 19 the results of a physical fitness test taken under this section.
- 20 <u>(c)</u> The commission shall suspend the license of a peace
- 21 officer who fails to comply with this section.
- SECTION 5. (a) Not later than December 1, 2017, the Texas
- 23 Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt rules necessary to
- 24 implement the changes in law made by this Act.
- 25 (b) Section 1701.306, Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 26 Act, applies only to an application for a license submitted to the
- 27 Texas Commission on Law Enforcement on or after the effective date

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- 1 of this Act. An application submitted before the effective date of
- 2 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the
- 3 application was submitted, and the former law is continued in
- 4 effect for that purpose.
- 5 (c) A person who holds a license as a peace officer issued
- 6 before the effective date of this Act may continue to renew that
- 7 license without complying with Section 1701.3555, Occupations
- 8 Code, as added by this Act.
- 9 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
