 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to issuance of a vendor permit for the sale of goods during
 1-20 an authorized event held in the Texas mall area of the Capitol
 1-21 Complex.

1-22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-23 SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 2165, Government Code, is
 1-24 amended by adding Section 2165.260 to read as follows:

1-25 Sec. 2165.260. TEXAS MALL AREA VENDOR PERMIT. (a) In this
 1-26 section, the "Texas mall area of the Capitol Complex" means the
 1-27 state-owned property within the area bounded on the north by Martin
 1-28 Luther King, Jr., Boulevard, on the east by Brazos Street, on the
 1-29 south by 15th Street, and on the west by Colorado Street.

1-30 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, the State Preservation
 1-31 Board by rule and in consultation with the commission and other
 1-32 appropriate state agencies shall establish a process for a vendor
 1-33 to apply for and obtain from the board a permit that allows the
 1-34 vendor to sell goods from a rented space during an event authorized
 1-35 by the board and held in the Texas mall area of the Capitol Complex.

1-36 (c) The State Preservation Board is not required to adopt
 1-37 the rules required under Subsection (b) until the Capitol Complex
 1-38 master plan developed under Section 2166.105 is implemented and the
 1-39 Texas mall proposed in the plan is established.

1-40 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
