Article 55.01, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 7 amended by adding Subsection (e) to read as follows: (e) Notwithstanding Article 1.14(a), a person may not 8 9 waive, as part of an agreement regarding the disposition of criminal charges based on the person's commission of an alleged 10 offense, any right of the person to an expunction under this chapter 11 12 that may exist in relation to that offense on or after the date the waiver is signed. A purported waiver of that right is void. 13 14 SECTION 2. Subchapter E-1, Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 411.078 to read as follows: 15 16 Sec. 411.078. WAIVER OF RIGHT TO ORDER OF NONDISCLOSURE PROHIBITED. Notwithstanding Article 1.14(a), Code of Criminal 17 Procedure, a person may not waive, as part of an agreement regarding 18 the disposition of criminal charges based on the person's 19 commission of an alleged offense, any right of the person to an 20 21 order of nondisclosure of criminal history record information under this subchapter that may exist in relation to that offense on or 22 23 after the date the waiver is signed. A purported waiver of that right is void. 24

1 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 2 a waiver of a person's right to an expunction or an order of 3 nondisclosure of criminal history record information made on or 4 after the effective date of this Act. A waiver made before the 5 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the 6 date the waiver was made, and the former law is continued in effect 7 for that purpose.

8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
