## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the filing of a court reporter's record in an appeal of
- 3 a final order in certain suits affecting the parent-child
- 4 relationship.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 263.405(a) and (b), Family Code, are
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) An appeal of a final order rendered under this
- 9 subchapter is governed by Section 263.4056 and the procedures for
- 10 accelerated appeals in civil cases under the Texas Rules of
- 11 Appellate Procedure. The appellate court shall render its final
- 12 order or judgment with the least possible delay.
- 13 (b) A final order rendered under this subchapter must
- 14 contain the following prominently displayed statement in boldfaced
- 15 type, in capital letters, or underlined: "A PARTY AFFECTED BY THIS
- 16 ORDER HAS THE RIGHT TO APPEAL. AN APPEAL IN A SUIT IN WHICH
- 17 TERMINATION OF THE PARENT-CHILD RELATIONSHIP IS SOUGHT IS GOVERNED
- 18 BY SECTION 263.4056, FAMILY CODE, AND THE PROCEDURES FOR
- 19 ACCELERATED APPEALS IN CIVIL CASES UNDER THE TEXAS RULES OF
- 20 APPELLATE PROCEDURE. FAILURE TO FOLLOW SECTION 263.4056, FAMILY
- 21 CODE, AND THE TEXAS RULES OF APPELLATE PROCEDURE FOR ACCELERATED
- 22 APPEALS MAY RESULT IN THE DISMISSAL OF THE APPEAL."
- SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 263, Family Code, is
- 24 amended by adding Section 263.4056 to read as follows:

- 1 Sec. 263.4056. DEADLINE FOR FILING COURT REPORTER'S RECORD
- 2 IN APPELLATE COURT. (a) In an appeal of a final order rendered
- 3 under this subchapter, the court reporter for the court that
- 4 rendered the order shall prepare and submit the reporter's record
- 5 of the trial to the appellate court not later than the 20th day
- 6 after the date the notice of appeal is filed with the court.
- 7 (b) On a showing of good cause, the appellate court may
- 8 extend the deadline for submitting the reporter's record. If the
- 9 court grants an extension under this subsection, the reporter's
- 10 record must be filed with the appellate court not later than the
- 11 40th day after the date the notice of appeal is filed with the
- 12 court.
- 13 (c) To the extent that this section conflicts with the Texas
- 14 Rules of Appellate Procedure, this section controls.
- 15 Notwithstanding Section 22.004, Government Code, this section may
- 16 not be modified or repealed by a rule adopted by the supreme court.
- SECTION 3. (a) Section 263.405(b), Family Code, as amended
- 18 by this Act, applies only to a final order rendered on or after the
- 19 effective date of this Act. An order rendered before that date is
- 20 governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
- 21 of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- (b) Section 263.4056, Family Code, as added by this Act,
- 23 applies only to an appeal of a final order rendered on or after the
- 24 effective date of this Act. An appeal of a final order rendered
- 25 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 26 effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that
- 27 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
