4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 40, Human Resources Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 40.0529 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 40.0529. BEST PRACTICES GUIDE FOR CHILD PROTECTIVE
8	SERVICES CASES. (a) The department shall develop a best practices
9	guide to establish uniform practices in child protective services
10	cases across this state. The guide must:
11	(1) describe the different stages of a child
12	protective services case, including intake, initial investigation,
13	assessment of the child and family, case planning, court
14	proceedings, case management services, and case closure;
15	(2) describe the roles and responsibilities of the
16	persons involved in each stage identified in Subdivision (1); and
17	(3) include definitions of commonly used terms, model
18	timelines and procedural flowcharts for the most common child
19	protective services cases, and a list by area of services available
20	to children and parents.
21	(b) The department shall design the best practices guide to

- 11 (c) The department shall make the best practices guide
- 12 available on the department's Internet website.
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
