A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to monetary assistance for a relative or other designated 3 caregiver of children in foster care.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 264.755, Family Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection (f) to read 7 as follows:

8 (a) The department shall[, subject to the availability of 9 funds,] enter into a caregiver assistance agreement with each 10 relative or other designated caregiver to provide monetary 11 assistance and additional support services to the caregiver. 12 <u>Subject to Subsection (f), the</u> [The] monetary assistance and 13 support services shall be based on a family's need, as determined by 14 rules adopted by the executive commissioner.

Monetary assistance provided under this section must 15 (b) 16 include a one-time cash payment to the caregiver on the initial placement of a child or a sibling group. The amount of the cash 17 payment, as determined by the department, may not exceed \$2,000 18 [\$1,000] for each child. The payment for placement of a sibling 19 group must be at least $\frac{$2,000}{[\$1,000]}$ for the group, but may not 20 21 exceed \$2,000 [\$1,000] for each child in the group. The cash payment must be provided not later than the 60th day after the date of [on] 22 the initial placement of each child with the caregiver and is 23 provided to assist the caregiver in purchasing essential child-care 24

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1 items such as furniture and clothing.

(f) Monetary assistance paid to a relative or other designated caregiver under a caregiver assistance agreement must be paid at a daily rate that is equal to at least 50 percent of the daily foster care reimbursement rate that the department would pay for the child if the substitute care were provided in a foster home, foster group home, agency foster home, or agency foster group home licensed or certified under Chapter 42, Human Resources Code.

9 SECTION 2. Section 264.755, Family Code, as amended by this 10 Act, applies only to monetary assistance with respect to a child who is initially placed with a relative or other designated caregiver 11 on or after the effective date of this Act. Monetary assistance 12 with respect to a child who is initially placed with a relative or 13 other designated caregiver before that date is governed by the law 14 15 in effect on the date of the initial placement, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 16

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
