	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the security of the electric grid.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. (a) The Electric Grid Security Advisory
5	Committee is created. The committee is composed of the following
6	members:
7	(1) two members appointed by the governor;
8	(2) two members appointed by the lieutenant governor;
9	and
10	(3) two members appointed by the speaker of the house
11	of representatives.
12	(b) Each member of the committee must have professional
13	experience or technical training in:
14	<pre>(1) cybersecurity;</pre>
15	(2) electromagnetic interference;
16	(3) electric power generation or transmission;
17	(4) electromagnetic pulse hardening;
18	(5) physical security and controls;
19	(6) space physics and weather;
20	(7) supervisory controls and data acquisition; or
21	(8) emergency preparedness.
22	(c) The governor shall designate a member of the committee
23	to serve as presiding officer.
24	(d) The committee shall convene at the call of the presiding

1 officer.

(e) The committee shall study the Texas electric grid and
the computer systems and networks related to it. The study must:
(1) evaluate and summarize the current state of the
electric grid and associated computer systems and networks;

6 (2) consider potential security threats to the 7 electric grid and associated computer systems and networks;

8 (3) assess whether further efforts are needed to 9 secure the electric grid and associated computer systems and 10 networks against damage, including the threat of electromagnetic 11 pulse or other attacks and natural threats, including solar flares; 12 and

13 (4) recommend measures to secure the electric grid and14 associated computer systems and networks against damage.

(f) The committee may share its findings with any state agency it considers important to the security of the electric grid or associated computer systems or networks. To the extent allowed by law, a state agency with which the committee shares information is encouraged to implement any recommendations that the agency determines will improve the security of the state's electric grid or associated computer systems or networks.

(g) ERCOT shall cooperate with the committee to provide any information and resources the committee considers important to the study.

(h) A member of the committee is not entitled to compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for the member's travel expenses as provided by Chapter 660, Government Code, and

1 the General Appropriations Act.

2 (i) A vacancy on the task force shall be filled for the 3 unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

4 (j) The committee is not subject to Chapter 2110, Government5 Code.

6 (k) Not later than December 1, 2018, the committee shall 7 prepare a report of its findings, including any recommendations for 8 legislation resulting from the findings, and shall submit the 9 report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of 10 the house of representatives.

(1) The committee's work relates to sensitive matters of security. Notwithstanding any other law, the meetings, work, and findings of the committee are not subject to the requirements of Chapter 551 or 552, Government Code. Each member of the committee shall sign a nondisclosure agreement stating that the member will not disclose to the public any sensitive or identifiable information related to grid security measures or plans.

18 (m) The committee is abolished and this section expires on19 December 31, 2018.

20 SECTION 2. Subchapter Z, Chapter 39, Utilities Code, is 21 amended by adding Section 39.917 to read as follows:

22 <u>Sec. 39.917. INFORMATION RELATED TO GRID SECURITY. The</u> 23 <u>independent organization certified under Section 39.151 shall</u> 24 <u>collect and compile information related to the security of the</u> 25 <u>electric grid. The information is confidential and is not subject</u> 26 <u>to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code.</u>

27 SECTION 3. The governor, the lieutenant governor, and the

speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint members to
 the Electric Grid Security Advisory Committee, as required by this
 Act, as soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act,
 but not later than the 120th day after the effective date of this
 Act.

6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
