## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the implementation of student financial assistance programs for veterans and their families. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 56, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 56.0065 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 56.0065. STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS FOR 7 VETERANS AND FAMILIES; EQUAL PROTECTION. (a) An institution of 8 9 higher education may not impose additional fees, obligations, or burdens concerning payment or registration on a student eligible 10 for state or federal military related student financial assistance 11 programs for military veterans or their family members that are not 12 otherwise required by those programs to be imposed for the purpose 13 14 of receiving that assistance. (b) An institution of higher education must provide for a 15 16 student described by Subsection (a) to defer payment of tuition and fees if the receipt of military related financial assistance 17 awarded to the student is delayed. The Texas Veterans Commission, 18 in cooperation with institutions of higher education, shall 19 prescribe a standard deferment request form for the purposes of 20 this subsection. 21 (c) This section does not prohibit an institution of higher 22 23 education from requiring a student described by Subsection (a) to submit a free application for federal student aid (FAFSA). 24
