A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a study by the Texas Department of Transportation on the
3	use of municipal impact fees for roadway facilities.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 395, Local Government
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 395.0115 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 395.0115. STUDY OF MUNICIPAL IMPACT FEES TO PAY FOR
8	ROADWAY FACILITIES. (a) The Texas Department of Transportation
9	shall conduct a study to determine the feasibility of using
10	municipal impact fees to pay for roadway facilities that are
11	necessary due to municipal development.
12	(b) In conducting the study, the Texas Department of
13	Transportation must consider:
14	(1) the roadway facility needs of municipalities;
15	(2) the amount of debt incurred by municipalities for
16	roadway facilities;
17	(3) the practicability of adopting impact fees for
18	roadway facilities in a municipality's roadway plan, considering
19	costs associated with fee imposition and collection;
20	(4) the potential and known effects of the imposition
21	and collection of impact fees on local transportation needs;
22	(5) the potential and known effects of the imposition
23	and collection of impact fees on the municipality's debt; and
24	(6) the practicability and potential effects of

- 1 remitting five percent of a municipality's impact fees to the
- 2 department for the construction and maintenance of state highways
- 3 attributable to development in the municipality.
- 4 (c) From the results of the study the Texas Department of
- 5 Transportation shall determine:
- 6 (1) the population threshold of a municipality for
- 7 which the imposition and collection of impact fees for roadway
- 8 facilities in the municipality's roadway plan is administratively
- 9 feasible;
- 10 (2) viable alternatives to municipal impact fees in
- 11 municipalities where the imposition and collection of impact fees
- 12 is not administratively feasible; and
- 13 (3) to what extent, if any, the adoption of impact fees
- 14 would alleviate the debt burden of municipalities.
- 15 <u>(d) The Texas Department of Transportation shall provide</u>
- 16 the results of the study and the determinations under Subsection
- 17 (c) to the members of the legislature not later than September 1,
- 18 2018.
- 19 (e) This section expires September 1, 2019.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
