Subchapter A, Chapter 243, Human Resources Code, is amended by adding Section 243.008 to read as follows: 7 Sec. 243.008. INFORMATION CONCERNING FOSTER CARE HISTORY. 8 (a) In this section, "foster care" means the placement of a child 9 in the conservatorship of a state agency responsible for providing 10 11 child protective services. 12 (b) The department, during the admission process, shall determine whether a child committed to the department has at any 13 14 time been in foster care. The department shall record the following on the child's intake form: 15 16 (1) whether the child is currently in foster care; and (2) if applicable, the number of times the child has 17 previously been placed in foster care. 18 (c) Not later than January 31 of each even-numbered year, 19 the department shall submit a report to the governor, the 20 21 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and each standing committee having primary jurisdiction over the 22 23 department. The report must summarize statistical information concerning the total number and percentage of children in the 24
