1-20 relating to the collection of information concerning the number of
 1-21 juvenile offenders committed to the Texas Juvenile Justice
 1-22 Department who have been in foster care.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 243, Human Resources Code,
 1-25 is amended by adding Section 243.008 to read as follows:

1-26 Sec. 243.008. INFORMATION CONCERNING FOSTER CARE HISTORY.

1-27 (a) In this section, "foster care" means the placement of a child
 1-28 in the conservatorship of a state agency responsible for providing
 1-29 child protective services.

1-30 (b) The department, during the admission process, shall
 1-31 determine whether a child committed to the department has at any
 1-32 time been in foster care. The department shall record the following
 1-33 on the child's intake form:

1-34 (1) whether the child is currently in foster care; and

1-35 (2) if applicable, the number of times the child has
 1-36 previously been placed in foster care.

1-37 (c) Not later than January 31 of each even-numbered year,
 1-38 the department shall submit a report to the governor, the
 1-39 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
 1-40 and each standing committee having primary jurisdiction over the
 1-41 department. The report must summarize statistical information
 1-42 concerning the total number and percentage of children in the
 1-43 custody of the department during the preceding two years who have at
 1-44 any time been in foster care.

1-45 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
