A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 relating to the authority of a retail public water utility to

3 require an operator of a correctional facility to comply with water

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 13, Water Code, is amended
- 7 by adding Section 13.1461 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 13.1461. CORRECTIONAL FACILITY COMPLIANCE WITH
- 9 CONSERVATION MEASURES. (a) This section applies only to a
- 10 correctional facility operated by the Texas Department of Criminal
- 11 Justice or operated under contract with that department.
- 12 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a retail public
- 13 utility may require the operator of a correctional facility that
- 14 receives retail water or sewer utility service from the retail
- 15 public utility to comply with water conservation measures adopted
- 16 or implemented by the retail public utility.
- 17 <u>(c)</u> A correctional facility is not required to comply with a
- 18 water conservation measure under Subsection (b) if the operator of
- 19 the correctional facility submits to the retail public utility a
- 20 written statement from the Texas Department of Criminal Justice
- 21 that states that the measure would endanger health and safety at the
- 22 facility or unreasonably increase the costs of operating the
- 23 facility.
- 24 (d) If a retail public utility suspends a water conservation

- 1 measure and later implements the same measure, the operator of a
- 2 correctional facility that received an exemption from the original
- 3 measure under Subsection (c) must submit a new written statement
- 4 from the Texas Department of Criminal Justice to obtain an
- 5 exemption under Subsection (c) from the newly implemented measure.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
