## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to establishing a pilot program under which public schools
- 3 may develop a portfolio method to assess student performance in
- 4 grades three through eight for purposes of accountability and
- 5 qualification for promotion.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 39, Education Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 39.02302 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 39.02302. PORTFOLIO ASSESSMENT PILOT PROGRAM FOR
- 10 GRADES THREE THROUGH EIGHT. (a) The commissioner shall establish a
- 11 pilot program as provided by this section under which participating
- 12 school districts may:
- 13 (1) implement a portfolio method to assess students in
- 14 grades three through eight; and
- 15 (2) use student performance under that method as a
- 16 percentage of a student's overall performance on assessment
- instruments, in addition to the student's performance on assessment
- 18 instruments required under Sections 39.023(a), (b), and (1), for
- 19 purposes of accountability under this chapter and qualification for
- 20 promotion under Section 28.0211.
- 21 (b) A school district may choose to participate in the pilot
- 22 program established under this section by submitting to the
- 23 commissioner for approval not later than May 1, 2018, a plan
- 24 described by this subsection and approved by the board of trustees

- 1 of the district. A school district that chooses to participate in
- 2 the pilot program must create a committee that consists of teachers
- 3 and administrators employed by and students enrolled in the
- 4 district to develop a three-year plan that:
- 5 (1) specifies the goals and guiding principles for
- 6 implementation of the district's portfolio assessment method;
- 7 (2) designates for assessment by the portfolio
- 8 assessment method:
- 9 (A) English language arts;
- 10 <u>(B) mathematics; and</u>
- 11 (C) any other subject as determined by the
- 12 committee;
- 13 (3) specifies the essential knowledge and skills that
- 14 must be addressed by the portfolio method of assessment for each
- 15 <u>subject designated under Subdivision (2);</u>
- 16 (4) designates the grades subject to portfolio
- 17 assessment;
- 18 <u>(5) provides for accommodations and any other support</u>
- 19 measures that comply with applicable federal law for students
- 20 enrolled in a special education program under Subchapter A, Chapter
- 21 29, and students of limited English proficiency, as defined by
- 22 <u>Section 29.052;</u>
- 23 (6) includes requirements for using components of the
- 24 portfolio assessment as:
- 25 (A) an interim formative assessment tool to
- 26 provide the student the opportunity to further develop
- 27 understanding and performance; and

1	(B) a final summative assessment;
2	(7) includes the method of submitting student
3	portfolios, which may include written submission, digital
4	delivery, an oral defense presentation, or a combination of those
5	methods; and
6	(8) includes a rubric for grading student portfolios
7	as provided by Subsection (c).
8	(c) The rubric included in the plan developed under
9	Subsection (b) must be developed by district teachers. In
10	developing the rubric, the district teachers may incorporate
11	suggestions from students enrolled in the district and community
12	and business leaders. The rubric must be based on a 100-point scale
13	scoring system and must establish a level of performance considered
14	satisfactory and a level of performance necessary to indicate
15	college readiness.
16	(d) Subject to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act
17	of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g), the plan developed under
18	Subsection (b) may provide for the use of portfolio assessments for
19	other purposes, including to:
20	(1) evaluate teacher performance;
21	(2) assist in developing campus turnaround plans and
22	other campus improvement initiatives under Subchapter E;
23	(3) assist in communicating with the student's parents
24	regarding the student's academic development; or
25	(4) provide relevant information in admission,
26	review, and dismissal committee and language proficiency
27	assessment committee meetings.

- (e) The commissioner shall review and make a determination on each plan submitted under this section on or before August 1, 2018. To participate in the pilot program, a school district must implement a plan approved by the commissioner under this section beginning with the 2018-2019 school year.
- 6 (f) For purposes of the pilot program, if a scale score 7 required for satisfactory performance under Section 39.0241(a) on 8 an assessment instrument required under Section 39.023(a), (b), or (1) is not based on a 100-point scale scoring system, the 9 commissioner shall provide for a conversion, in accordance with 10 commissioner rule, of the scale score to an equivalent score based 11 12 on a 100-point scale scoring system. A student's performance under the portfolio assessment method for a grade and subject shall be 13 combined with the student's performance on the assessment 14 15 instrument administered under Section 39.023(a), (b), or (1), as applicable, for that grade and subject to determine the student's 16 17 overall performance. For purposes of assigning districts and campuses a performance rating under Section 39.054, a student's 18 19 performance under the portfolio assessment method for a grade and subject is considered as 50 percent of the student's overall 20 performance. For purposes of determining whether a student 21 22 performed satisfactorily on an assessment instrument required under Section 28.0211 to qualify for promotion, a student's 23 performance under the portfolio assessment method for 24 applicable grade and subject is considered as 65 percent of the 25 26 student's overall performance.
- 27 (g) For purposes of assigning districts and campuses a

- 1 performance rating under Section 39.054, the commissioner shall
- 2 consider districts and campuses participating in the pilot program
- 3 separately. The commissioner shall adopt rules to substitute a
- 4 student's overall performance computed as provided by Subsection
- 5 (f) for purposes of accountability for the student's performance on
- 6 assessment instruments required under Section 39.023(a), (b), or
- 7 (1), as applicable.
- 8 (h) A school district that participates in the pilot program
- 9 shall provide student performance data to the agency as required by
- 10 agency rule. The agency shall periodically review the performance
- 11 data submitted under this subsection.
- 12 (i) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 13 <u>implement this section</u>, including:
- 14 (1) rules for submitting to the commissioner for
- 15 approval a plan described by Subsection (b) and subsequent
- 16 <u>amendments to the plan;</u>
- 17 (2) rules for evaluating submitted plans and
- 18 amendments described by Subdivision (1);
- 19 (3) rules for submitting student performance data to
- 20 the agency as required under Subsection (h); and
- 21 (4) any specific rules for school districts or
- 22 campuses that are rated unacceptable and choose to participate in
- 23 the pilot program under this section.
- 24 (j) Not later than September 1, 2022, the agency shall
- 25 prepare and deliver to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the
- 26 speaker of the house of representatives, and the presiding officer
- 27 of each legislative standing committee with primary jurisdiction

- 2 (1) evaluates the implementation and performance
- 3 results of the pilot program under this section; and
- 4 (2) makes recommendations regarding the feasibility
- 5 of statewide application of establishing a portfolio method to
- 6 assess student performance in grades three through eight for
- 7 purposes of accountability and qualification for promotion.
- 8 (k) This section expires September 1, 2023.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
