A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to an annual adjustment to the basic allotment under the
- 3 foundation school program to reflect inflation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 42.101, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-3) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (a) Subject to adjustment under Subsection (a-3), for [For]
- 9 each student in average daily attendance, not including the time
- 10 students spend each day in special education programs in an
- 11 instructional arrangement other than mainstream or career and
- 12 technology education programs, for which an additional allotment is
- 13 made under Subchapter C, a district is entitled to an allotment
- 14 equal to the lesser of \$4,765 or the amount that results from the
- 15 following formula:
- 16 $A = $4,765 \times (DCR/MCR)$
- 17 where:
- "A" is the allotment to which a district is entitled;
- "DCR" is the district's compressed tax rate, which is the
- 20 product of the state compression percentage, as determined under
- 21 Section 42.2516, multiplied by the maintenance and operations tax
- 22 rate adopted by the district for the 2005 tax year; and
- "MCR" is the state maximum compressed tax rate, which is the
- 24 product of the state compression percentage, as determined under

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- 1 Section 42.2516, multiplied by \$1.50.
- 2 (a-3) Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, the basic
- 3 allotment provided to a district under Subsection (a) or (b) is
- 4 <u>adjusted annually to increase the allotment by the greater of:</u>
- 5 (1) one percent of the amount of the allotment for the
- 6 preceding school year; or
- 7 (2) the amount that results from applying the
- 8 inflation rate, as determined by the comptroller on the basis of
- 9 changes in the Texas Consumer Price Index, to the allotment for the
- 10 preceding school year.
- 11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
