A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

	AN	ACT
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- 2 relating to the review of privately operated residential facilities
- 3 for persons released on parole or to mandatory supervision.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 6 (1) "Department" means the Texas Department of
- 7 Criminal Justice.
- 8 (2) "Releasee" means a person released on parole or to
- 9 mandatory supervision.
- 10 SECTION 2. REVIEW OF RESIDENTIAL FACILITIES. The
- 11 department shall review instances in which a releasee housed in a
- 12 facility operated under contract with the department has absconded
- 13 from supervision, with a particular emphasis on facilities in which
- 14 the rate of absconsion exceeds the statewide average for all
- 15 facilities. The department shall analyze the factors that
- 16 contribute to releasees absconding, include to what extent a higher
- 17 rate of absconsion from a particular facility is attributable to
- 18 the types of releasees residing in the facility or to issues related
- 19 to the staff of the facility, and make recommendations regarding:
- 20 (1) improvements to the procedures used by the
- 21 department to:
- (A) assess whether a releasee is likely to
- 23 abscond from supervision; and
- 24 (B) identify the appropriate residence for a

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- 1 releasee; and
- 2 (2) legislative changes to the department's
- 3 contracting powers, including any provisions to:
- 4 (A) determine the most suitable private vendors
- 5 with which to contract for the housing, supervision, and
- 6 programmatic support of releasees; and
- 7 (B) establish minimum requirements for the
- 8 staffing of a facility housing releasees under a contract with the
- 9 department.
- SECTION 3. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2018, the
- 11 department shall report the results of the review and analysis
- 12 required by Section 2 of this Act and make recommendations to the
- 13 governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 14 representatives, and the standing legislative committees with
- 15 primary jurisdiction over the department.
- 16 SECTION 4. ASSISTANCE BY BOARD OF PARDONS AND PAROLES. On
- 17 request of the department, the Board of Pardons and Paroles shall
- 18 provide information to the department or otherwise assist the
- 19 department in conducting the review and preparing the report
- 20 required by this Act.
- 21 SECTION 5. EXPIRATION. This Act expires June 1, 2019.
- 22 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
- 23 1, 2017.
