A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 relating to student access to public school instructional materials

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 26.006, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsections (d) and (e) to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 (c) A student's parent is entitled to request that the
- 9 school district or open-enrollment charter school the student
- 10 attends allow the student to take home any instructional materials
- 11 used by the student. Subject to the availability of the
- 12 instructional materials, the district or school shall honor the
- 13 request. A student who takes home instructional materials must
- 14 return the instructional materials to school at the beginning of
- 15 the next school day if requested to do so by the student's teacher.
- 16 A school district or open-enrollment charter school must provide
- 17 the instructional materials to the student in printed book format
- 18 if the student does not have reliable access to technology at the
- 19 <u>student's home.</u> In this subsection, "instructional material" has
- 20 the meaning assigned by Section 31.002.
- 21 (d) A school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 22 must document each parental request made under Subsection (c) to
- 23 allow a student to take home instructional material used by the
- 24 student that the district or school denies. The documentation must

- 1 include the reasons for denying the request. Not later than the
- 2 30th day after the date the district or school receives the request,
- 3 the district or school must report to the agency that the request
- 4 has been denied.
- 5 (e) Not later than September 1 of each year, the agency
- 6 shall submit an annual report to the legislature that includes the
- 7 number of parental requests made under Subsection (c) to allow a
- 8 student to take home instructional material used by the student
- 9 that each school district and open-enrollment charter school denied
- 10 and the reasons for the denial.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 26.006, Education Code, as amended by
- 12 this Act, applies beginning with the 2017-2018 school year.
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
