Section 692A.009, Health and Safety Code, as 19 amended by this Act, applies only to an anatomical gift made on or 20 after the effective date of this Act. An anatomical gift made 21 22 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that 23 24 law is continued in effect for that purpose. 25 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
