A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the persons authorized to make an anatomical gift.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Section 692A.002(13), Health and Safety Code, is  
5 amended to read as follows:

6 (13) "Guardian" means a person appointed by a court to  
7 make decisions regarding the support, care, education, health, or  
8 welfare of an individual. The term does not include:

9 (A) a guardian ad litem;

10 (B) a procurement organization; or

11 (C) any person associated with the hospital in  
12 possession of the decedent's body other than a person described by  
13 Section 692A.009(2), (3), (4), (5), (6), or (7).

14 SECTION 2. Section 692A.009, Health and Safety Code, is  
15 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to  
16 read as follows:

17 (a) Subject to Subsections (b) and (c) and unless barred by  
18 Section 692A.007 or Section 692A.008, an anatomical gift of a  
19 decedent's body or part for the purpose of transplantation,  
20 therapy, research, or education may be made by any member of the  
21 following classes of persons who is reasonably available, in the  
22 order of priority listed:

23 (1) an agent of the decedent at the time of death who  
24 could have made an anatomical gift under Section 692A.004(2)

1 immediately before the decedent's death;

2 (2) the spouse of the decedent;

3 (3) adult children of the decedent;

4 (4) parents of the decedent;

5 (5) adult siblings of the decedent;

6 (6) adult grandchildren of the decedent;

7 (7) grandparents of the decedent;

8 (8) an adult who exhibited special care and concern

9 for the decedent other than a person associated with the hospital in

10 possession of the decedent's body; and

11 (9) the persons who were acting as the guardians of the

12 person of the decedent at the time of death[+

13 [~~(10) the hospital administrator; and~~

14 [~~(11) any other person having the authority to dispose~~

15 ~~of the decedent's body].~~

16 (d) A procurement organization may not petition a court to

17 become the decedent's guardian or to otherwise be authorized to

18 make an anatomical gift of the decedent's body or part.

19 SECTION 3. Section 692A.009, Health and Safety Code, as

20 amended by this Act, applies only to an anatomical gift made on or

21 after the effective date of this Act. An anatomical gift made

22 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in

23 effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that

24 law is continued in effect for that purpose.

25 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
