4	SECTION 1. Section 692A.009(a), Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	(a) Subject to Subsections (b) and (c) and unless barred by
7	Section 692A.007 or Section 692A.008, an anatomical gift of a
8	decedent's body or part for the purpose of transplantation,
9	therapy, research, or education may be made by any member of the
10	following classes of persons who is reasonably available, in the
11	order of priority listed:
12	(1) an agent of the decedent at the time of death who
13	could have made an anatomical gift under Section 692A.004(2)
14	immediately before the decedent's death;
15	(2) the spouse of the decedent;
16	(3) adult children of the decedent;
17	(4) parents of the decedent;
18	(5) adult siblings of the decedent;
19	(6) adult grandchildren of the decedent;
20	(7) grandparents of the decedent;
21	(8) an adult who exhibited special care and concerr
22	for the decedent;
23	(9) the persons who were acting as the guardians of the
24	person of the decedent at the time of death; and

- 1 (10) [the hospital administrator; and
- 2 $\left[\frac{(11)}{(11)}\right]$ any other person having the authority to
- 3 dispose of the decedent's body.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 692A.009(a), Health and Safety Code, as
- 5 amended by this Act, applies only to an anatomical gift made on or
- 6 after the effective date of this Act. An anatomical gift made
- 7 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 8 effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that
- 9 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
