A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT
relating to requiring public institutions of higher education to
establish a policy and prevention and outreach program on campus
sexual assault, family violence, and stalking.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Section 51.9363, Education Code, is amended to
read as follows:
Sec. 51.9363. CAMPUS SEXUAL ASSAULT, FAMILY VIOLENCE, AND
STALKING POLICY AND PREVENTION. (a) In this section:
(1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher
Education Coordinating Board.
(2) "Family violence" has the meaning assigned by
Section 71.004, Family Code.
(3) "Institution [, "institution] of higher
education" has the meaning assigned by Section 61.003.
(b) Each institution of higher education shall adopt a
policy on campus sexual assault, family violence, and stalking. The
policy must:
(1) include:
(A) definitions of prohibited behavior;
(B) sanctions for violations; and
(C) the protocol for reporting and responding to

- 1 (2) be approved by the institution's governing board
- 2 before final adoption by the institution.
- 3 (c) Each institution of higher education shall make the
- 4 institution's campus sexual assault, family violence, and stalking
- 5 policy available to students, faculty, and staff members by:
- 6 (1) including the policy in the institution's student
- 7 handbook and personnel handbook; and
- 8 (2) creating and maintaining a web page on the
- 9 institution's Internet website dedicated solely to the policy.
- 10 (d) Each institution of higher education shall require each
- 11 entering freshman or undergraduate transfer student to attend an
- 12 orientation on the institution's campus sexual assault, family
- 13 violence, and stalking policy before or during the first semester
- 14 or term in which the student is enrolled at the institution. The
- 15 institution shall establish the format and content of the
- 16 orientation. The orientation must include the information
- 17 described by Subsection (e)(2).
- 18 (e) Each institution of higher education shall develop and
- 19 implement a comprehensive prevention and outreach program on campus
- 20 sexual assault, family violence, and stalking. The program must:
- 21 (1) address a range of strategies to prevent campus
- 22 sexual assault, family violence, and stalking, including a victim
- 23 empowerment program, a public awareness campaign, primary
- 24 prevention, bystander intervention, and risk reduction; and
- 25 (2) provide to all students enrolled at the
- 26 <u>institution</u> and all student organizations recognized by or
- 27 registered with the institution information regarding the

- 1 institution's campus sexual assault, family violence, and stalking
- 2 policy, including what constitutes consent to sexual activity and
- 3 the rights and responsibilities of students under the policy.
- 4 (f) Each biennium, each institution of higher education
- 5 shall review the institution's campus sexual assault, family
- 6 violence, and stalking policy and, with approval of the
- 7 institution's governing board, revise the policy as necessary.
- 8 (g) An institution of higher education may not receive any
- 9 state funding for a fiscal year following a year in which the
- 10 coordinating board determines that the institution has not
- 11 substantially complied with the requirements under this section.
- 12 (h) The coordinating board may adopt rules as necessary to
- 13 enforce this section.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 51.9363, Education Code, as amended by
- 15 this Act, applies beginning with the 2018 spring semester.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
