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- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 54.0514 to read as follows:
- Sec. 54.0514. LIMITATION ON TOTAL AMOUNT OF TUITION. (a) 8
- In this section, "tuition" includes: 9
- (1) tuition for which the rates are prescribed by this 10
- chapter; and 11
- 12 (2) tuition charged by an institution of higher
- education under Section 54.0513 or another law authorizing an 13
- 14 institution to establish tuition rates.
- 15 (b) The total amount of tuition charged by an institution of
- 16 higher education to a student for an academic year may not exceed an
- amount equal to the total amount of tuition that the institution 17
- would have charged under this chapter to a similarly situated 18
- student for the 2015-2016 academic year. For purposes of this 19
- subsection, students are similarly situated if they share the same 20
- residency status, degree program, course load, course level, 21
- tuition exemption status, and other circumstances affecting the 22
- 23 tuition charged to the student. This subsection does not ensure
- that the total amount of tuition charged to an individual student 24

- 1 does not increase based on a change in the student's residency
- 2 status, degree program, course load, course level, tuition
- 3 exemption status, or other circumstance affecting the tuition
- 4 charged to the student.
- 5 SECTION 2. Sections 54.0513(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) In addition to amounts that a governing board of an
- 8 institution of higher education is authorized to charge as tuition
- 9 under the other provisions of this chapter, the governing board $[\tau]$
- 10 under the terms the governing board considers appropriate, and
- 11 charge any student an amount designated as tuition, not to exceed
- 12 the maximum amount that enables the institution to comply with
- 13 Section 54.0514, that the governing board considers necessary for
- 14 the effective operation of the institution.
- 15 (b) Subject to the limit provided by Subsection (a) on the
- 16 amount designated as tuition charged under this section, a [A]
- 17 governing board may set a different tuition rate under this section
- 18 for each program and course level offered by each institution of
- 19 higher education[. A governing board may set a different tuition
- 20 rate] as the governing board considers appropriate to increase
- 21 graduation rates, encourage efficient use of facilities, or enhance
- 22 employee performance.
- SECTION 3. Sections 54.0515(e) and (f), Education Code, are
- 24 amended to read as follows:
- 25 (e) It is the legislature's intent that each institution of
- 26 higher education[, as a condition to tuition deregulation under
- 27 Section 54.0513, reasonably implement the following:

- 1 (1) each institution shall make satisfactory progress
- 2 towards the goals provided in its master plan for higher education
- 3 and in "Closing the Gaps," the state's master plan for higher
- 4 education, or a successor state master plan; and
- 5 (2) each institution shall meet acceptable
- 6 performance criteria, including measures such as graduation rates,
- 7 retention rates, enrollment growth, educational quality, efforts
- 8 to enhance minority participation, opportunities for financial
- 9 aid, and affordability.
- 10 (f) The committee shall:
- 11 (1) meet at the call of either chair;
- 12 (2) monitor and regularly report to the legislature on
- 13 each institution of higher education's compliance with the
- 14 requirements of Subsection (e); and
- 15 (3) receive and review information concerning the
- 16 affordability and accessibility of higher education[, including
- 17 the impact of tuition deregulation].
- 18 SECTION 4. The heading to Chapter 54, Education Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 CHAPTER 54. TUITION, [AND] FEES, AND OTHER STUDENT CHARGES
- 21 SECTION 5. The heading to Subchapter E, Chapter 54,
- 22 Education Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 23 SUBCHAPTER E. OTHER FEES, [AND] DEPOSITS, OR CHARGES
- SECTION 6. Subchapter E, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
- 25 amended by adding Sections 54.5001 and 54.5002 to read as follows:
- Sec. 54.5001. LIMITATIONS ON FEE AMOUNTS.
- 27 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this subchapter or

- 1 other law, in any academic year, the governing board of an
- 2 institution of higher education may not charge a fee under this
- 3 subchapter in an amount that is greater than the amount of the fee
- 4 charged by the institution in the 2015-2016 academic year.
- 5 (b) The limitation provided by this section applies to a fee
- 6 even if an increase in the amount of the fee is approved by a vote of
- 7 the students, student government, or student fee advisory committee
- 8 of the institution of higher education.
- 9 Sec. 54.5002. LIMITATIONS ON AMOUNT OF CERTAIN CHARGES.
- 10 Notwithstanding any other law, an institution of higher education
- 11 may not charge to a student for on-campus housing, parking, or
- 12 meals, or for any other on-campus good or service the charge for
- 13 which is set by the institution, an amount that is greater than the
- 14 amount the institution would have charged for that good or service
- 15 <u>during the 2015-2016 academic year, unless the institution</u>
- 16 demonstrates that the increase is justified by an increase in
- 17 underlying costs for the good or service, such as labor or supply
- 18 costs, as demonstrated by an increase in the consumer price index,
- 19 as defined by Section 341.201, Finance Code, and certified by the
- 20 Legislative Budget Board.
- 21 SECTION 7. This Act applies beginning with tuition, fees,
- 22 and other charges charged by public institutions of higher
- 23 education for the 2018 fall semester. Tuition, fees, and other
- 24 charges charged by an institution of higher education in an
- 25 academic period before that semester are covered by the law in
- 26 effect before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is
- 27 continued in effect for that purpose.

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1 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
