4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 62, Education Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER D. OUTCOMES-BASED FUNDING FOR GENERAL ACADEMIC TEACHING
8	<u>INSTITUTIONS</u> [PERFORMANCE INCENTIVE FUNDING]
9	Sec. 62.071. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "At-risk student" means an undergraduate student
11	of an eligible institution:
12	(A) whose score on the <u>SAT</u> [Scholastic Assessment
13	Test (SAT) or ACT [the American College Test (ACT)] is less than
14	the national mean score of students' scores on that test;
15	(B) who has been awarded a grant under the
16	federal Pell Grant program;
17	(C) who was 20 years of age or older on the date
18	the student initially enrolled in the institution;
19	(D) who is enrolled as a part-time student; or
20	(E) who did not receive a high school diploma but
21	received a high school equivalency certificate [within the last six
22	years].
23	(2) ["Critical field" means:
24	[(A) the field of engineering, computer science,

- 1 mathematics, physical science, allied health, nursing, or teacher
- 2 certification in a field of science or mathematics; and
- 3 [(B) any other field of study identified as a
- 4 critical field by the coordinating board in "Closing the Gaps," the
- 5 state's master plan for higher education.
- 6 [(3) "Eligible institution" means a general academic
- 7 teaching institution other than a public state college.

- 9 [and "public state college" have] the meaning [meanings] assigned
- 10 by Section 61.003.
- 11 Sec. 62.072. BIENNIAL DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS BASED ON
- 12 DEGREES AWARDED. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) or
- 13 Section 62.073, for each state fiscal biennium, the coordinating
- 14 board shall distribute from any funds appropriated to the
- 15 coordinating board by the legislature for the purposes of this
- 16 <u>subchapter</u>, and any other funds made available for the purposes of
- 17 this subchapter, to each general academic teaching institution an
- 18 amount based on the average number of bachelor's degrees in the
- 19 categories described by this subsection awarded by the institution
- 20 annually in the three most recent academic years for which that
- 21 information is available, as determined on the January 1 preceding
- 22 the biennium. The amount distributed to each institution in a
- 23 biennium is:
- 24 (1) \$500 for each bachelor's degree awarded to a
- 25 student who is not an at-risk student; and
- 26 (2) \$1,000 for each bachelor's degree awarded to an
- 27 at-risk student.

(b) If the total amount of funds required to be distributed 1 to general academic teaching institutions under Subsection (a) for 2 a state fiscal biennium is more than the total amount of funds 3 available for distribution under this subchapter for that biennium, 4 the amount allocated under Subsection (a) to each institution shall 5 be reduced proportionately so that the total amount to be 6 distributed to all institutions equals the total amount of 7 available funds. [FUNDING. (a) For each state fiscal year, the 8 coordinating board shall distribute any performance incentive 9 funds appropriated by the legislature for purposes of this 10 subchapter, and any other funds made available for the purposes of 11 this subchapter, to eligible institutions as follows: 12 [(1) 50 percent to be distributed among eligible 13 institutions in proportion to the increase, if any, in the average 14 15 number of degrees awarded annually by each institution in the two 16 most recent fiscal years from the average number of degrees awarded annually by that institution in the two fiscal years immediately 17 preceding those fiscal years, using the weights assigned to each 18 degree under the table prescribed by Subsection (b); and 19 20 [(2) the remaining 50 percent to be distributed among 21 eligible institutions in proportion to the average number of degrees awarded annually by each institution in the three most 22 recent fiscal years, using the weights assigned to each degree 23 24 under the table prescribed by Subsection (b). 25 (b) A number of points is assigned for each degree awarded by an eligible institution according to the following table: 26

DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS CONTINGENT ON FULL FUNDING OF BASE FORMULA FUNDING. Funds may be distributed under 6 this subchapter for a state fiscal biennium only if the instruction 7 and operations formula for all general academic teaching 8 institutions for undergraduate education under Section 61.059 is 9 funded by appropriation for that biennium at a level, per weighted 10 semester credit hour, that is equal to or greater than the level, 11 12 per weighted semester credit hour, at which that formula was funded by appropriation for all general academic teaching institutions in 13 14 the preceding state fiscal biennium, as that level is adjusted for 15 inflation. Sec. 62.074. RULES. The coordinating board shall adopt 16 17 rules for the administration of this subchapter, including any rules the coordinating board considers necessary regarding the 18 submission to the coordinating board by general academic teaching 19 [eligible] institutions of any [student] data required for the 20 coordinating board to carry out its duties under this subchapter. 21 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 23 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 25

Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
