H.B. No. 1292

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the Texas Funeral Service Commission; authorizing fees.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 651.051(a), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) The Texas Funeral Service Commission consists of seven members appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate as follows:

(1) one member [~~two members~~] who is [~~are~~] licensed as both an embalmer and a funeral director for at least the five years preceding appointment to the commission;

(2) one member who is licensed as a funeral director and is a registered cemetery owner or operator; [~~and~~]

(3) one member who is licensed as a funeral director and is a licensed crematory establishment operator; and

(4) four members who represent the public and who:

(A) are not regulated under this chapter; and

(B) have consistently shown an interest in supporting consumer protection.

SECTION 2. Section 651.055(c), Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

(c) It is a ground for removal from the commission that a member:

(1) does not have at the time of appointment the

1 qualifications required by Sections 651.051(a) and (c) and
2 651.052(a);

3 (2) does not maintain during service on the commission
4 the qualifications required by Sections 651.051(a) and (c) and
5 651.052(a);

6 (3) violates a prohibition established by Section
7 651.053 [~~Sections 651.053(a)-(e) or 651.506(h)~~];

8 (4) cannot because of illness or disability discharge
9 the member's duties for a substantial part of the term for which the
10 member is appointed; or

11 (5) is absent for more than half of the regularly
12 scheduled commission meetings that the member is eligible to attend
13 during a calendar year unless the absence is excused by majority
14 vote of the commission.

15 SECTION 3. The heading to Section 651.101, Occupations
16 Code, is amended to read as follows:

17 Sec. 651.101. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR[~~, BOND~~].

18 SECTION 4. The heading to Section 651.151, Occupations
19 Code, is amended to read as follows:

20 Sec. 651.151. GENERAL LICENSING POWERS AND DUTIES.

21 SECTION 5. Section 651.151(c), Occupations Code, is
22 redesignated as Section 651.1511, Occupations Code, and amended to
23 read as follows:

24 Sec. 651.1511. COMMITTEES. [~~(c)~~] The commission may
25 appoint a committee from its members to consider and make a
26 recommendation on a matter referred to the committee by the
27 commission.

1 SECTION 6. Section 651.154, Occupations Code, is amended to
2 read as follows:

3 Sec. 651.154. FEES. (a) The commission shall set the
4 following fees in amounts reasonable and necessary to administer
5 this chapter:

6 (1) the funeral director's and embalmer's application
7 fee, license fee, renewal fee, late renewal penalty, duplicate
8 license fee, replacement license fee, and reciprocal license fee;
9 and

10 (2) the cemetery, crematory, or funeral establishment
11 license fee, renewal fee, and late renewal penalty.

12 (b) The commission shall set the provisional license
13 application fee, examination fee, renewal fee, and late renewal
14 penalty in amounts reasonable and necessary to administer the
15 provisional license program.

16 (c) The commission shall set the following fees in amounts
17 reasonable and necessary to administer the continuing education
18 program under this chapter:

19 (1) the continuing education provider fee and
20 continuing education course fee; and

21 (2) the continuing education noncompliance fee [~~may~~
22 ~~not charge a fee to a perpetual care cemetery, including a fee for~~
23 ~~issuing or renewing a license issued under this chapter~~].

24 SECTION 7. Sections 651.157, 651.1571, and 651.158,
25 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows:

26 Sec. 651.157. INSPECTION OF [~~CEMETERY~~] CREMATORY[~~Y~~] OR
27 FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT. (a) A crematory or funeral establishment

1 must be inspected before an initial license may be issued to the
2 crematory or funeral establishment.

3 (a-1) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a [~~licensed~~
4 ~~cemetery,~~] crematory[~~7~~] or funeral establishment shall be
5 inspected at least once every two years by an agent of the
6 commission or by an agent of the state or a political subdivision
7 authorized by the commission to make inspections on its behalf.

8 (b) If the commission finds a violation of this chapter or
9 of Chapter 193, 361, 711, 714, 715, or 716, Health and Safety Code,
10 the commission shall inspect the [~~cemetery,~~] crematory[~~7~~] or
11 funeral establishment annually until the commission determines
12 that the crematory or funeral establishment is free of violations.

13 (c) A report of each inspection made under this section
14 shall be retained in the crematory's or funeral establishment's
15 licensing file [~~filed with the commission~~].

16 (d) The commission by rule shall establish:

17 (1) procedures for the inspection of a [~~cemetery,~~]
18 crematory[~~7~~] or funeral establishment required by this section; and

19 (2) criteria, including consideration of the
20 crematory's or funeral establishment's inspection and complaint
21 history, regarding when the commission should inspect a crematory
22 or funeral [~~an~~] establishment based on the risk of a violation at a
23 crematory or funeral [~~an~~] establishment.

24 (e) A premises on which funeral directing, [~~interment,~~]
25 cremation, or embalming is practiced shall be open at all times to
26 inspection for any violation of this chapter or of Chapter 193, 361,
27 or 716, Health and Safety Code, by:

- 1 (1) an agent of the commission;
2 (2) an authorized agent of the state; or
3 (3) an authorized agent of the county or municipality
4 in which the premises is located.

5 (f) Before a commission agent inspects a [~~cemetery,~~
6 crematory~~]~~ or funeral establishment, the agent shall review the
7 inspection reports filed with the commission on the crematory or
8 funeral establishment. During the inspection, the agent shall
9 determine whether previously identified problems have been
10 corrected and whether a pattern of violations exists. The
11 commission shall consider the information from the inspection
12 reports in determining whether a penalty should be imposed against
13 a crematory or funeral [~~an~~] establishment.

14 Sec. 651.1571. INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN
15 CEMETERIES [~~, EXCEPTION FOR PERPETUAL CARE CEMETERIES~~]. (a) A
16 cemetery licensed by the commission [~~This section and Section~~
17 ~~651.157 do not apply to perpetual care cemeteries.~~

18 [~~(b) Except as provided by Section 651.157(b):~~

19 [~~(1) a cemetery~~] may not be inspected unless:

20 (1) [~~(A)~~] an interment has occurred in the cemetery
21 within the two years preceding the inspection; or

22 (2) [~~(B)~~] the commission has received a complaint
23 about the cemetery.

24 (b) The [~~and~~

25 [~~(2) the~~] commission shall give lower priority to an
26 inspection of a cemetery than to an inspection of a crematory or
27 funeral establishment.

1 Sec. 651.158. INSPECTION OF CERTAIN FACILITIES. (a) The
2 commission may require a funeral establishment that has solid waste
3 disposal and sanitation facilities that have not been inspected by
4 the [~~Texas~~] Department of State Health Services to obtain
5 inspection of those facilities by an entity other than the [~~Texas~~]
6 Department of State Health Services.

7 (b) The commission by rule shall establish procedures for an
8 inspection required under this section.

9 SECTION 8. Sections [651.160](#)(a) and (b), Occupations Code,
10 are amended to read as follows:

11 (a) The commission and the [~~Texas~~] Department of State
12 Health Services shall adopt a joint memorandum of understanding
13 that:

14 (1) outlines the responsibilities of each agency in
15 enforcing requirements under Chapters [193](#) and [361](#), Health and
16 Safety Code, that affect funeral establishments;

17 (2) establishes procedures by which each agency:

18 (A) may refer a complaint to the other; and

19 (B) will notify the other of a violation by a
20 funeral establishment of Chapter [193](#) or [361](#), Health and Safety
21 Code; and

22 (3) coordinates inspection and enforcement efforts by
23 both agencies for measures that a funeral establishment is required
24 to implement under Chapters [193](#) and [361](#), Health and Safety Code.

25 (b) Not later than the last month of each state fiscal year,
26 the commission and the [~~Texas~~] Department of State Health Services
27 shall review and update the memorandum of understanding.

1 SECTION 9. Section 651.004, Occupations Code, is
2 transferred to Subchapter D, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, and
3 redesignated as Section 651.168, Occupations Code, to read as
4 follows:

5 Sec. 651.168 [~~651.004~~]. REGULATION OF CEMETERY AND
6 CREMATORY SERVICES. (a) The commission shall regulate cemetery
7 and crematory services as provided by this chapter and Chapter 716,
8 Health and Safety Code.

9 (b) The commission may not regulate cemetery or crematory
10 services that occur after burial or inurnment unless the services
11 relate to the care and treatment of the remains in an urn, casket,
12 or outer enclosure.

13 SECTION 10. Section 651.201, Occupations Code, is amended
14 by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

15 (c) A funeral establishment may print additional copies of
16 the brochure only if the commission is unable to provide the number
17 of brochures needed by the funeral establishment.

18 SECTION 11. Subchapter E, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is
19 amended by adding Section 651.2015 to read as follows:

20 Sec. 651.2015. INTERNET WEBSITES. The commission may allow
21 a funeral establishment that maintains an Internet website to link
22 to the commission's Internet website.

23 SECTION 12. Section 651.203, Occupations Code, is amended
24 to read as follows:

25 Sec. 651.203. RECORD OF COMPLAINTS. (a) The commission
26 shall maintain a record [~~file~~] on each written complaint filed with
27 the commission. The record [~~file~~] must include:

- 1 (1) the subject matter of the complaint;
- 2 (2) the date the complaint is received by the
3 commission;
- 4 (3) the name of the person who filed the complaint;
- 5 (4) the name of each person contacted in relation to
6 the complaint;
- 7 (5) a summary of the results of the review or
8 investigation of the complaint; and
- 9 (6) an explanation of the reason the complaint [~~file~~]
10 was closed, if the commission closed the complaint [~~file~~] without
11 taking action other than to investigate the complaint.

12 (b) Information in a record [~~file~~] maintained under this
13 section, other than information relating to a complaint that has
14 not reached a final disposition, is public information.

15 SECTION 13. Section [651.252](#), Occupations Code, is amended
16 to read as follows:

17 Sec. 651.252. LICENSE APPLICATION. (a) The commission may
18 adopt license application requirements [~~An applicant~~] for a funeral
19 director's license or an embalmer's license [~~must submit a written~~
20 ~~license application to the commission and pay the application fee~~].

21 (b) The commission may provide that a person applies for a
22 funeral director's or embalmer's license by completing a
23 provisional license program under Subchapter G [~~require an~~
24 ~~applicant to appear before at least one member of the commission for~~
25 ~~approval of the person's application. The approval is subject to~~
26 ~~review by the entire commission.~~

27 [~~(c) The commission shall keep a permanent, alphabetical~~

1 ~~record of each license application and the action taken on the~~
2 ~~application. The record must indicate the current status of each~~
3 ~~application and license issued].~~

4 SECTION 14. Section 651.164, Occupations Code, is
5 transferred to Subchapter F, Chapter 651, Occupations Code,
6 redesignated as Section 651.2525, Occupations Code, and amended to
7 read as follows:

8 Sec. 651.2525 [~~651.164~~]. LICENSE EXPIRATION. (a) A funeral
9 director's or embalmer's license is valid for 24 months.

10 (b) The commission by rule shall [~~may~~] adopt a system under
11 which licenses expire on various dates during the year. For an
12 initial license that is issued for a term of less than 24 months
13 [~~the year in which the license expiration date is changed~~], the
14 commission shall prorate license fees on a monthly basis so that
15 each license holder pays only that portion of the license fee that
16 is allocable to the number of months during which the license is
17 valid. On renewal of the license on the new expiration date, the
18 total license renewal fee is payable.

19 SECTION 15. Section 651.253, Occupations Code, is amended
20 to read as follows:

21 Sec. 651.253. GENERAL LICENSE REQUIREMENTS. (a) To be
22 eligible for a funeral director's license or an embalmer's license,
23 an applicant must:

- 24 (1) be at least 18 years of age;
- 25 (2) have graduated from an accredited high school or
26 passed an examination prescribed by the Texas Education Agency;
- 27 (3) have graduated from an accredited school or

1 college of mortuary science;

2 (4) unless the applicant holds a reciprocal license,
3 have completed the requirements of the provisional license program;
4 and

5 (5) have successfully completed the ~~[applicable]~~
6 written examinations ~~[examination]~~ described by Section 651.254
7 and by Section 651.255 or 651.256, as applicable.

8 (b) Unless the applicant is seeking a reciprocal license, an
9 ~~[An]~~ applicant for a funeral director's license or an embalmer's
10 license may not be considered for that license until the
11 applicant~~[+~~

12 ~~[(1)]~~ completes all of the requirements of the
13 provisional license program~~[, and~~

14 ~~[(2) attains a grade of at least 75 percent on the~~
15 ~~written examination given by the commission].~~

16 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (a)(3), the commission may
17 adopt rules to allow an applicant who graduated from a school or
18 college of mortuary science that is no longer accredited to become
19 licensed as a funeral director or embalmer.

20 SECTION 16. Section 651.254, Occupations Code, is amended
21 to read as follows:

22 Sec. 651.254. MORTUARY LAW EXAMINATION. (a) The
23 commission shall administer or arrange for the administration of a
24 written examination developed by the commission or developed for
25 the commission under a contract on:

26 (1) laws applicable to vital statistics pertaining to
27 dead human bodies; and

1 (2) local and state rules and laws relating to the
2 preparation, transportation, care, and disposition of dead human
3 bodies.

4 (b) To pass the examination, an individual must receive a
5 grade of at least 75 percent. [~~LICENSE EXAMINATIONS; RESULTS. (a)~~
6 ~~The examinations for a funeral director's license and an embalmer's~~
7 ~~license shall be held at least annually. The examinations shall be~~
8 ~~given at the time and place designated by the commission. The~~
9 ~~commission shall give notice of the examinations.~~

10 ~~[(b) Not later than the 30th day after the date a person~~
11 ~~takes a licensing examination under this chapter, the commission~~
12 ~~shall notify the person of the results of the examination.~~

13 ~~[(c) If the examination is graded or reviewed by a testing~~
14 ~~service:~~

15 ~~[(1) the commission shall notify the person of the~~

25 EMBALMER'S LICENSE. The commission shall administer or arrange for
26 the administration of[+]

3 (A) [~~(i)~~] the cavities of the human body; and

4 (B) [~~(ii)~~] the arterial and venous system of the

7 (3) [~~(C)~~] bacteriology and hygiene;

8 (4) [~~(D)~~] pathology;

27 Sec. 651.258. LICENSE ISSUANCE. On issuance of a funeral

1 director's license or an embalmer's license under this chapter, a
2 majority of the commission members shall sign the license. A [~~The~~
3 license issued by the commission authorizes the license holder to
4 practice embalming, funeral directing, or both.

5 Sec. 651.259. APPLICATION BY OUT-OF-STATE LICENSE HOLDER.

6 (a) The commission shall waive any requirement for a funeral
7 director's license or an embalmer's license for an applicant who
8 holds a license issued by another state, country, or territory that
9 has license requirements substantially equivalent to the
10 requirements of this state and who meets the requirements of this
11 section. The commission may waive any license requirement for an
12 applicant who holds a license issued by another state that does not
13 have license requirements substantially equivalent to those of this
14 state and who meets the requirements of this section. [~~The~~
15 ~~applicant shall pay a license fee in an amount set by the~~
16 ~~commission.~~]

17 (b) Any applicant for a license under this section shall
18 file an [~~a sworn~~] application that includes:

19 (1) a sworn statement that:

20 (A) the applicant is the person to whom the
21 license was issued;

22 (B) the license under which the applicant
23 practiced as a funeral director or embalmer in the state, country,
24 or territory from which the applicant moved was, at the time the
25 applicant left, in effect;

26 (C) no proceeding has been instituted against the
27 applicant for the cancellation, suspension, or revocation of the

1 license in the state, country, or territory that issued the
2 license; and

3 (D) [~~(C)~~] no prosecution is pending against the
4 applicant in a state or federal court for an offense that, under the
5 laws of this state, is a felony, or is a misdemeanor related to the
6 practice of embalming or funeral directing; ~~and~~

7 (2) an affidavit of a person described by Subsection
8 (c) verifying that:

9 (A) the accompanying license has not been
10 canceled, suspended, or revoked; and

11 (B) the statement of the qualifications made in
12 the application for licensure in this state is correct; and

13 (3) documentation that the applicant has graduated
14 from an accredited college of mortuary science.

15 (c) The affidavit must be made by:

16 (1) the presiding officer or secretary of the
17 governmental entity that issued the license; or

18 (2) a registration officer of the state, country, or
19 territory that issued the license.

20 ~~(d) [The applicant must affirm in the statement that the~~
21 ~~license under which the applicant practiced as a funeral director~~
22 ~~or embalmer in the state, country, or territory from which the~~
23 ~~applicant moved was, at the time the applicant left, in effect.~~

24 [~~(e)~~] An applicant must submit to [~~The commission shall~~
25 ~~conduct~~] a criminal background check before submitting a license
26 application [~~on each applicant~~]. An applicant is not eligible for a
27 license under this section if the applicant has, in the 10 years

1 preceding the date of the application, been finally convicted of a
2 misdemeanor involving moral turpitude or a felony.

3 (e) [~~(f)~~] An applicant for a license under this section
4 must ~~[+~~

5 [~~(1)~~] provide proof that ~~[+~~

6 [~~(A)~~ the license is in good standing,

7 [~~(B)~~] the applicant has practiced under the
8 license for at least:

9 (1) [~~(i)~~] one year in the state, country, or territory
10 that issued the license if that state, country, or territory has
11 license requirements substantially equivalent to those of this
12 state; or

13 (2) [~~(ii)~~] five years in the state, country, or
14 territory that issued the license if that state, country, or
15 territory does not have license requirements substantially
16 equivalent to those of this state.

17 (f) An applicant under this section must successfully
18 complete the written examination described by Section 651.254 ~~[, and~~

19 [~~(C)~~ the applicant has graduated from an
20 accredited college of mortuary science, and

21 [~~(2)~~ pass a written examination of not more than 50
22 questions on applicable state laws and commission rules].

23 (g) On approval of the application, the applicant shall pay
24 a license fee in an amount set by the commission ~~[The commission~~
25 ~~shall conduct the examination under Subsection (f)(2) at each~~
26 ~~regularly scheduled meeting of the commission].~~

27 SECTION 18. The heading to Section 651.260, Occupations

1 Code, is amended to read as follows:

2 Sec. 651.260. REPLACEMENT [~~DUPLICATE~~] LICENSE.

3 SECTION 19. Sections 651.260(a) and (c), Occupations Code,
4 are amended to read as follows:

5 (a) If a license issued under this chapter is lost or
6 destroyed, the license holder may apply to the commission for a
7 replacement [~~duplicate~~] license.

8 (c) The commission shall issue a replacement [~~duplicate~~]
9 license after receipt of the information and payment of the fee set
10 by the commission for the replacement [~~duplicate~~] license.

11 SECTION 20. Section 651.261, Occupations Code, is amended
12 to read as follows:

13 Sec. 651.261. POSTING OF LICENSE. (a) A license holder
14 shall conspicuously display the holder's original license,
15 duplicate original license, or replacement license in each place of
16 business at which the license holder practices.

17 (b) The commission shall issue a duplicate original license
18 on application and payment of a fee set by the commission for the
19 license if the license holder needs a license to display in multiple
20 locations.

21 SECTION 21. Section 651.266, Occupations Code, is amended
22 to read as follows:

23 Sec. 651.266. CONTINUING EDUCATION. The commission by rule
24 may require continuing education as a condition for license renewal
25 except for a license holder described by Section 651.155 or an
26 applicant for renewal described by Section 651.265(b) [~~651.265~~].

27 If the commission requires continuing education, the commission

1 shall require completion of a minimum number of hours of ethics
2 training as a required part of that education.

3 SECTION 22. Section 651.165, Occupations Code, is
4 transferred to Subchapter F, Chapter 651, Occupations Code,
5 redesignated as Section 651.2661, Occupations Code, and amended to
6 read as follows:

7 Sec. 651.2661 [~~651.165~~]. RENEWAL OR REINSTATEMENT OF
8 LICENSE. (a) A person who is otherwise eligible to renew a license
9 may renew an unexpired license by paying the required renewal fee to
10 the commission before the expiration date of the license. A person
11 whose license has expired may not engage in activities that require
12 a license until the license has been renewed.

13 (b) A person whose license has been expired for 90 days or
14 less may renew the license by paying to the commission a renewal fee
15 that is equal to 1-1/2 times the normally required renewal fee.

16 (c) A person whose license has been expired for more than 90
17 days but less than one year may renew the license by paying to the
18 commission a renewal fee that is equal to two times the normally
19 required renewal fee.

20 (d) A person whose license has been expired for one year or
21 more may reinstate [~~renew~~] the license by:

22 (1) retaking and passing the [~~applicable~~] examination
23 under Section 651.254;

24 (2) paying any applicable fees, including a renewal
25 fee that is equal to two times the normally required renewal fee;
26 and

27 (3) completing any continuing education required

1 under Section 651.266.

2 (e) A person who was licensed in this state, moved to
3 another state, and is currently licensed and has been in practice in
4 the other state for the two years preceding the date of application
5 may obtain a new license without reexamination if both licenses are
6 in good standing. The person must pay to the commission a fee that
7 is equal to two times the normally required renewal fee for the
8 license.

9 (f) At least 30 days before the expiration of a person's

11 (1) acts or holds the person out as a funeral director,
12 embalmer, or provisional license holder without being licensed
13 under this chapter;

14 (2) [~~makes a first call in a manner that~~] violates
15 Section 651.401;

16 (3) is a funeral director, embalmer, or provisional
17 license holder and engages in a funeral practice that violates this
18 chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter; or

19 (4) violates Chapter 154, Finance Code, or a rule
20 adopted under that chapter, regardless of whether the Texas
21 Department of Banking or another governmental agency takes action
22 relating to the violation.

23 SECTION 53. Section 651.652, Occupations Code, is amended
24 to read as follows:

25 Sec. 651.652. APPLICABILITY. (a) This subchapter applies
26 only to a crematory that sells goods or services related to the
27 [~~burial or~~] final disposition of a body.

14 SECTION 55. Section 651.051(a), Occupations Code, as
15 amended by this Act, applies only to a member of the Texas Funeral
16 Service Commission appointed on or after the effective date of this
17 Act. A member appointed before the effective date of this Act may
18 continue to serve until the expiration of the member's term.

19 SECTION 56. Sections 651.253 and 651.259, Occupations Code,
20 as amended by this Act, apply only to a person who applies for a
21 funeral director's license or embalmer's license on or after the
22 effective date of this Act. A person who applies for a funeral
23 director's license or embalmer's license before the effective date
24 of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the person
25 applied for that license, and the former law is continued in effect
26 for that purpose.

27 SECTION 57. Section 651.2661, Occupations Code, as

1 transferred, redesignated, and amended by this Act, applies only to
2 a person who applies for reinstatement of a license on or after the
3 effective date of this Act. A person who applies for renewal of a
4 license under former Section 651.165, Occupations Code, before the
5 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
6 date the person applied for renewal, and the former law is continued
7 in effect for that purpose.

8 SECTION 58. Section 651.2662, Occupations Code, as
9 transferred, redesignated, and amended by this Act, applies only to
10 a person who applies for reinstatement of a license on or after the
11 effective date of this Act. A person who applies for renewal of a
12 license under former Section 651.1655, Occupations Code, before the
13 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
14 date the person applied for renewal, and the former law is continued
15 in effect for that purpose.

16 SECTION 59. Section 651.267, Occupations Code, as amended
17 by this Act, applies only to a person who applies for reissuance of
18 a license on or after the effective date of this Act. A person who
19 applies for reissuance of a license before the effective date of
20 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the person
21 applied for reissuance, and the former law is continued in effect
22 for that purpose.

23 SECTION 60. Section 651.502, Occupations Code, as amended
24 by this Act, applies only to a person who applies for the issuance
25 or renewal of a license on or after the effective date of this Act. A
26 person who applies for the issuance or renewal of a license before
27 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on

1 the date the person applied, and the former law is continued in
2 effect for that purpose.

3 SECTION 61. Section 651.5029, Occupations Code, as added by
4 this Act, applies only to a violation that occurs on or after the
5 effective date of this Act. A violation that occurs before the
6 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
7 date the violation occurred, and the former law is continued in
8 effect for that purpose.

9 SECTION 62. Section 651.505, Occupations Code, as amended
10 by this Act, applies only to a person placed on probation on or
11 after the effective date of this Act. A person placed on probation
12 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
13 effect on the date the person was placed on probation, and the
14 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

15 SECTION 63. Section 651.506, Occupations Code, as amended
16 by this Act, and Section 651.50601, Occupations Code, as
17 redesignated and amended by this Act, apply only to a proceeding
18 initiated on or after the effective date of this Act. A proceeding
19 initiated before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
20 law in effect on the date the proceeding was initiated, and the
21 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

22 SECTION 64. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
