## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to the establishment of the emergency medical services 3 assistance program.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 773, Health and Safety Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Subchapter I to read as follows:

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- 7 SUBCHAPTER I. EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
- 8 Sec. 773.251. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 9 (1) "Educational curriculum" means a
- 10 distance-learning emergency medical services curriculum that
- 11 provides remote courses of instruction and training to emergency
- 12 medical services personnel who serve a rural area.
- 13 (2) "Postsecondary educational institution" means any
- 14 institution, public or private, which provides courses of
- 15 instruction beyond that offered in secondary schools.
- 16 (3) "Program" means the emergency medical services
- 17 <u>assistance program established under this subchapter.</u>
- 18 Sec. 773.252. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM. (a) The
- 19 <u>department</u> shall establish the emergency medical services
- 20 assistance program to provide financial and educational assistance
- 21 to eligible emergency medical services providers.
- 22 (b) The program includes grants to eligible emergency
- 23 medical services providers and an educational curriculum to provide
- 24 training to rural emergency medical services personnel.

- 1 Sec. 773.253. RULES. (a) The executive commissioner shall
- 2 adopt rules necessary to implement this subchapter, including rules
- 3 for:
- 4 (1) determining eligibility under the program;
- 5 (2) establishing requirements for the educational
- 6 curriculum; and
- 7 (3) establishing requirements for a postsecondary
- 8 educational institution that develops and offers the educational
- 9 curriculum.
- 10 <u>(b) The rules must require that:</u>
- 11 (1) an emergency medical services provider
- 12 demonstrate financial need to be eligible for assistance under the
- 13 program;
- 14 (2) a postsecondary educational institution applying
- 15 to offer the educational curriculum demonstrate the qualifications
- 16 necessary to develop and offer the educational curriculum; and
- 17 (3) the educational curriculum provide to rural
- 18 emergency medical services personnel the remote instructional
- 19 courses and training necessary for the personnel to achieve
- 20 department certification under Subchapter C.
- Sec. 773.254. APPLICATION BY EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES
- 22 PROVIDER. (a) An emergency medical services provider may apply to
- 23 the department in the form and manner provided by department rule to
- 24 receive assistance under the program.
- 25 (b) If the department determines an applicant is eligible
- 26 for assistance under the program, the department may provide a
- 27 grant under Section 773.257 to the applicant.

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- Sec. 773.255. EDUCATIONAL CURRICULUM. (a) A postsecondary
- 2 educational institution may apply to the department in the form and
- 3 manner provided by department rule to develop and offer the
- 4 educational curriculum under this subchapter.
- 5 (b) The department may contract with not more than three
- 6 qualified postsecondary educational institutions to develop and
- 7 offer the educational curriculum under this subchapter.
- 8 Sec. 773.256. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT. The department may
- 9 provide administrative support to the program.
- Sec. 773.257. GRANTS. (a) The commissioner may use money
- 11 <u>from the permanent fund for emergency medical services and trauma</u>
- 12 care established under Section 403.106, Government Code, to provide
- 13 grants, in addition to funding available from other sources, to
- 14 emergency medical services providers applying for assistance under
- 15 the program or to provide funding to a postsecondary educational
- 16 <u>institution</u> offering the educational curriculum under this
- 17 <u>subchapter.</u>
- 18 (b) The commissioner shall ensure that at least 60 percent
- 19 of the grants provided under this section are provided to emergency
- 20 medical services providers that serve a rural area.
- 21 <u>(c) The executive commissioner by rule shall establish a</u>
- 22 procedure for the Governor's EMS and Trauma Advisory Council to
- 23 establish priorities for issuance of grants under this section.
- 24 (d) The department shall distribute grants under this
- 25 section in accordance with the requirements of Subsection (b) and
- 26 the grant priorities established under Subsection (c).
- 27 SECTION 2. Section 542.4031, Transportation Code, is

- 1 amended by amending Subsections (g) and (h) and adding Subsection
- 2 (h-1) to read as follows:
- 3 (g) Of the money received by the comptroller under this
- 4 section, the comptroller shall deposit:
- 5 (1) 63.67 [67] percent to the credit of the
- 6 undedicated portion of the general revenue fund; [and]
- 7 (2) 33 percent to the credit of the designated trauma
- 8 facility and emergency medical services account under Section
- 9 780.003, Health and Safety Code; and
- 10 (3) 3.33 percent to the credit of the permanent fund
- 11 for emergency medical services and trauma care under Section
- 12 403.106, Government Code.
- (h) Notwithstanding Subsection (g)(1), in any state fiscal
- 14 year the comptroller shall deposit 63.67 [67] percent of the money
- 15 received under Subsection (e)(2) to the credit of the general
- 16 revenue fund only until the total amount of the money deposited to
- 17 the credit of the general revenue fund under Subsection (g)(1) and
- 18 Section 780.002(b), Health and Safety Code, equals \$250 million for
- 19 that year. If in any state fiscal year the amount received by the
- 20 comptroller under those laws for deposit to the credit of the
- 21 general revenue fund exceeds \$250 million, the comptroller shall
- 22 deposit the additional amount to the credit of the Texas mobility
- 23 fund.
- 24 (h-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (g)(3), if in any state
- 25 fiscal year the amount received by the comptroller under that
- 26 subsection for deposit to the credit of the permanent fund for
- 27 emergency medical services and trauma care exceeds \$3 million, the

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- 1 comptroller shall deposit the additional amount to the credit of
- 2 the general revenue fund.
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 542.4031, Transportation Code, as
- 4 amended by this Act, applies only to the distribution of revenue
- 5 collected on or after the effective date of this Act. The
- 6 distribution of revenue collected before the effective date of this
- 7 Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the revenue was
- 8 collected, and that law is continued in effect for the purpose of
- 9 the distribution of that revenue.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
