AN ACT 1 2 relating to voting procedures for certain federal postcard 3 applicants and military personnel serving overseas. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 67.003(b), Election Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 Except as provided by Subsection (c), each local (b) canvassing authority shall convene to conduct the local canvass at 8 the time set by the canvassing authority's presiding officer [For 9 an election held on the uniform election date in May, the 10 local canvass must occur] not later than the 11th day after 11 election day and not earlier than the later of: 12 the third day after election day; 13 (1)14 (2) the date on which the early voting ballot board has verified and counted all provisional ballots, if a provisional 15 16 ballot has been cast in the election; or (3) the date on which all timely received ballots cast 17 from addresses outside of the United States are counted, if a ballot 18 to be voted by mail in the election was provided to a person outside 19 of the United States. 20 SECTION 2. Section 101.057, Election Code, is amended to 21 read as follows: 22 Sec. 101.057. RETURN OF VOTED BALLOT. (a) 23 A ballot voted

1 mail, common or contract carrier, or courier.

(b) A ballot voted by a voter described by Section 101.001(2)(A) or (B) shall be counted if the ballot arrives at the address on the carrier envelope not later than the sixth day after the date of the election, except that if that date falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal state or national holiday, then the deadline is extended to the next regular business day.

8 SECTION 3. Sections 105.004(b), (c), (d), and (e), Election 9 Code, are amended to read as follows:

10 (b) The secretary of state shall select to participate in 11 the program <u>any county</u> [a number of counties as determined by the 12 secretary of state] that:

13 (1) <u>desires</u> [desire] to participate in the program; 14 and

15 (2) <u>is</u> [are] determined by the secretary of state to
16 have the appropriate technological capabilities.

17 (c) The secretary of state shall operate the program 18 established under Subsection (a) [as a pilot program] until 19 September 1, <u>2021</u> [2017].

(d) Not later than January 1, <u>2021</u> [2017], the secretary of state shall file a report with the legislature. The report may include the secretary of state's recommendations on the future use of e-mail ballot submission by members of the armed forces of the United States and suggestions for permanent statutory authority regarding e-mail ballot submission by members of the armed forces of the United States.

SECTION 4. Section 67.003(a), Election Code, is repealed.
 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
