12	physician or provider who submitted the claim for a late payment
13	penalty. A late payment penalty under this section:
14	(1) is equal to 20 percent of the outstanding claim
15	amount;
16	(2) must be paid not later than the seventh day after
17	the date the liability for the penalty accrues under this section;
18	<u>and</u>
19	(3) is in addition to any other penalty or recourse to
20	which the physician or provider may be entitled under a contract

with the managed care organization.
