- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 382.220(a) and (b), Health and Safety
- 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:

- 8 under Section 382.202(g) or 382.302 may be appropriated only for

- 20 (1) expand and enhance the AirCheck Texas Repair and

- 23 remotely determine vehicle emissions and notify the vehicle's

- 3 (4) develop and implement projects in consultation
