A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to providing road district powers to the Wood Trace Municipal Utility District No. 3 of Montgomery County, Texas; 3 providing authority to issue bonds. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 6, Special District Local Laws 7 Code, is amended by adding Chapter 7965 to read as follows: CHAPTER 7965. WOOD TRACE MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 3 OF 8 9 MONTGOMERY COUNTY, TEXAS SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS 10 Sec. 7965.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "district" 11 12 means the Wood Trace Municipal Utility District No. 3 of Montgomery 13 County, Texas. 14 Sec. 7965.002. FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PURPOSE AND BENEFIT. (a) The district is created to serve a public purpose and benefit. 15 16 (b) The district is created to accomplish the purposes of: (1) a municipal utility district as provided by 17 general law and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution; and 18 (2) Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, that 19 relate to the construction, acquisition, improvement, operation, 20 or maintenance of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or 21 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads. 22 23 SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES 24 Sec. 7965.101. AUTHORITY FOR ROAD PROJECTS. Under Section

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52, Article III, Texas Constitution, the district may design, 1 acquire, construct, finance, issue bonds for, improve, operate, 2 maintain, and convey to this state, a county, or a municipality for 3 operation and maintenance macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or 4 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads. 5 6 Sec. 7965.102. ROAD STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS. (a) A road 7 project must meet all applicable construction standards, zoning and subdivision requirements, and regulations of each municipality in 8 whose corporate limits or extraterritorial jurisdiction the road 9 10 project is located. (b) If a road project is not located in the corporate limits 11 or extraterritorial jurisdiction of a municipality, the road 12 project must meet all applicable construction standards, 13 subdivision requirements, and regulations of each county in which 14 the road project is located. 15 (c) If the state will maintain and operate the road, the 16 17 Texas Transportation Commission must approve the plans and specifications of the road project. 18 19 SUBCHAPTER C. BONDS Sec. 7965.201. BONDS FOR ROAD PROJECTS. At the time of 20 issuance, the total principal amount of bonds or other obligations 21 issued or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad 22 valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of the 23 24 real property in the district. SECTION 2. (a) The legal notice of the intention to 25 26 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this

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Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a

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copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
Government Code.

5 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has 6 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on 7 Environmental Quality.

8 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the 9 10 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives within the required time. 11

12 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this 13 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect 14 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled 15 and accomplished.

16 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
