5	SECTION 1. Chapter 33, Utilities Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter F to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER F. REVIEW OF RATES OF CERTAIN MUNICIPAL UTILITIES
8	Sec. 33.151. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter applies only
9	to a municipally owned utility:
10	(1) that serves at least 400,000 customers; and
11	(2) whose service area is in the ERCOT power region in
12	a municipality with a population of less than 1.3 million.
13	Sec. 33.152. REVIEW OF RATES; CUSTOMER CHOICE. (a)
14	Notwithstanding any other law, a retail customer or group of
15	customers with a total usage of more than 25 million kilowatt hours
16	per year may file a petition for commission review of current or
17	proposed rates of a municipally owned utility that apply to the
18	<pre>petitioning customers.</pre>
19	(b) Not later than the 90th day after the date a petition is

- 22 commission that complies in all material respects with the rules
- 23 and forms prescribed by the commission. The commission for good
- 24 cause may extend the deadline for filing the rate application.

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- 1 (c) The commission shall conduct a full review of the rates
- 2 that apply to the petitioning customers to determine whether the
- 3 rates are:
- 4 (1) just and reasonable under Chapter 36; and
- 5 (2) consistent with rates available to similarly
- 6 <u>situated customers in areas of the state that have access to</u>
- 7 <u>customer choice.</u>
- 8 (d) If the commission finds that the rates are not just and
- 9 reasonable or are not consistent with the rates available to
- 10 similarly situated customers in areas of the state that have access
- 11 to customer choice, the commission shall:
- 12 (1) set rates for the petitioning customer or
- 13 customers that are just, reasonable, and consistent with the rates
- 14 available to similarly situated customers in areas of the state
- 15 that have access to customer choice; or
- 16 (2) set cost-based transmission and distribution
- 17 rates for the municipally owned utility and allow a petitioning
- 18 customer or customers to purchase electricity through a retail
- 19 electric provider.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
