## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the dispensing of certain drugs by physicians.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 157.002(f), Occupations Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (f) Subsections (b) and (c) do not authorize a physician or
- 7 a person acting under the supervision of a physician to keep a
- 8 pharmacy, advertised or otherwise, for the retail sale of dangerous
- 9 drugs, other than as authorized under Section 158.001(b) [158.003],
- 10 without complying with the applicable laws relating to the
- 11 dangerous drugs.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 158.001, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 13 amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsections (a-1) and
- 14 (d) to read as follows:
- 15 (a) <u>In this section, "dangerous drug" has the meaning</u>
- assigned by Section 483.001, Health and Safety Code.
- 17 <u>(a-1)</u> A physician licensed under this subtitle may supply a
- 18 patient with any drug, remedy, or clinical supply necessary to meet
- 19 the patient's immediate needs.
- 20 (b) A physician may dispense dangerous drugs to the
- 21 physician's patients and charge the patients for the drugs [This
- 22 section does not permit a physician to operate a retail pharmacy]
- 23 without complying with Chapter 558.
- 24 (d) Before dispensing a dangerous drug to a patient under

- 1 Subsection (b), a physician must disclose to the patient:
- 2 (1) the cost of the drug to the physician; and
- 3 (2) the price the patient will be charged for the drug
- 4 by the physician.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 551.004(b), Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (b) This subtitle does not prevent a practitioner from:
- 8  $\underline{\text{(1)}}$  administering a drug to a patient of the 9 practitioner; or
- 10 (2) supplying dangerous drugs to a patient as provided
- 11 by Section 158.001(b).
- 12 SECTION 4. Section 563.051(d), Occupations Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (d) This section does not authorize a physician or a person
- 15 acting under the supervision of a physician to keep a pharmacy,
- 16 advertised or otherwise, for the retail sale of dangerous drugs,
- 17 other than as authorized under Section 158.001(b) [158.003],
- 18 without complying with the applicable laws relating to the
- 19 dangerous drugs.
- 20 SECTION 5. Section 158.003, Occupations Code, is repealed.
- 21 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
