- 2 relating to the transfer of certain functions related to emergency
- 3 services districts from the Department of Agriculture to the
- 4 Department of State Health Services and the Texas Commission on

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 419.904, Government Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 419.904. [TECHNICAL] ASSISTANCE TO EMERGENCY SERVICES
- 10 DISTRICTS. The commission may [on request] provide:
- 11 (1) to emergency services districts technical
- 12 assistance on request [to emergency services districts], including
- 13 advice on the efficient and effective provision of fire protection
- 14 within a district;
- 15 (2) to fire departments in rural areas information
- 16 relating to assistance programs offered to rural volunteer
- 17 firefighters, including the federal Staffing for Adequate Fire and
- 18 Emergency Response grant program to help fire departments increase
- 19 staffing and deployment capabilities; and
- 20 (3) to rural homeowners information relating to the
- 21 benefits of volunteer fire departments, including a reduction in
- 22 <u>homeowners insurance risk ratings, lower homeowners insurance</u>
- 23 rates, and better fire protection.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 12, Health and Safety

- 1 Code, is amended by adding Section 12.021 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 12.021. EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT PROGRAM. The
- 3 department shall serve as a resource to provide interested rural
- 4 communities with:
- 5 <u>(1) general information about emergency services</u>
- 6 <u>districts; and</u>
- 7 (2) information and training related to the
- 8 <u>establishment of an emergency services district.</u>
- 9 SECTION 3. Sections 775.083(a), (b), and (c), Health and
- 10 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) On or before January 1 of each year, a district shall
- 12 file with the [Texas] Department of State Health Services [Rural
- 13 Affairs] an annual report that includes the following:
- 14 (1) the district's name;
- 15 (2) the name of each county in which the district is
- 16 located;
- 17 (3) the district's business address;
- 18 (4) the name, mailing address, and term of office of
- 19 each commissioner;
- 20 (5) the name, mailing address, and term of office of
- 21 the district's general manager, executive director, and fire chief;
- 22 (6) the name of each legal counsel or other consultant
- 23 for the district; and
- 24 (7) the district's annual budget and tax rate for the
- 25 preceding fiscal year.
- 26 (b) The [Texas] Department of State Health Services [Rural
- 27 Affairs] may not charge a fee for filing the report.

- 1 (c) The [Texas] Department of State Health Services [Rural
- 2 Affairs] shall develop and maintain an Internet-based system that
- 3 enables:
- 4 (1) a district to securely file the report and update
- 5 the district's information; and
- 6 (2) the public to view, in a searchable format, the
- 7 reports filed by districts under this section.
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 487.061, Government Code, is repealed.
- 9 SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 10 775.083, Health and Safety Code, applies only to an annual report
- 11 due on or after January 1, 2019. An annual report due before
- 12 January 1, 2019, is governed by the law as it existed immediately
- 13 before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in
- 14 effect for that purpose.
- 15 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
