## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the transfer of certain functions related to emergency 1-18 services districts from the Department of Agriculture to the Texas 1-19 1-20 Division of Emergency Management.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 487.061, Government Code, is transferred to Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, redesignated as 1-22 1-23 1-24 Section 418.053, Government Code, and amended to read as follows: 1-25

Sec. <u>418.053</u> [<u>487.061</u>]. EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT PROGRAM. (a) The <u>division</u> [<del>department</del>] shall serve as a resource to provide interested rural communities with: 1-26 1-27 1-28

(1) general information about emergency services 1-29 districts; and

1-30 (2) information and training related the to 1-31 establishment of an emergency services district. 1-32 (b)

The <u>division</u> [<del>department</del>] may: (1) provide to fire departments in rural 1-33 areas information relating to assistance programs offered to rural volunteer firefighters, including the federal Staffing for 1-34 1-35 1-36 Adequate Fire and Emergency Response grant program to help fire 1-37 departments increase staffing and deployment capabilities; and

1-38 (2) provide to rural homeowners information relating 1-39 the benefits of volunteer fire departments, including a to 1-40 reduction in homeowners insurance risk ratings, lower homeowners 1-41 insurance rates, and better fire protection.

SECTION 2. Sections 775.083(a), (b), and (c), Health and 1-42 1-43 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

1 - 44(a) On or before January 1 of each year, a district shall 1-45 file with the Texas Division of Emergency Management [Department of 1-46 Rural Affairs] an annual report that includes the following: 1-47

(1)the district's name; the name of each county in which the district is (2)

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2-1 of Rural Affairs] shall develop and maintain an Internet-based 2-2 system that enables:

2-3 (1) a district to securely file the report and update 2-4 the district's information; and

2-5 (2) the public to view, in a searchable format, the 2-6 reports filed by districts under this section.

2-7 SECTION 3. Not later than January 1, 2018, the following are 2-8 transferred from the Department of Agriculture to the Texas 2-9 Division of Emergency Management:

2-10 (1) the powers, duties, functions, programs, and 2-11 activities of the Department of Agriculture relating to the duties 2-12 described by Section 418.053, Government Code, as transferred, 2-13 redesignated, and amended by this Act;

2-14 (2) any obligations and contracts of the Department of 2-15 Agriculture that are directly related to implementing a power, 2-16 duty, function, program, or activity described by Subdivision (1) 2-17 of this section; and

2-18 (3) all property and records in the custody of the 2-19 Department of Agriculture that are related to a power, duty, 2-20 function, program, or activity described by Subdivision (1) of this 2-21 section and all funds appropriated by the legislature for that 2-22 power, duty, function, program, or activity. 2-23 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act to Section

2-23 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act to Section 2-24 775.083, Health and Safety Code, applies only to an annual report 2-25 due on or after January 1, 2019. An annual report due before 2-26 January 1, 2019, is governed by the law as it existed immediately 2-27 before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in 2-28 effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
