6	SECTION 1. Section 615.003, Government Code, is amended to
7	read as follows:
8	Sec. 615.003. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to
9	eligible survivors of the following individuals:
10	(1) an individual <u>:</u>
11	(A) elected, appointed, or employed as a peace
12	officer by the state or a political subdivision of the state under
13	Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or other law; or
14	(B) employed as a peace officer by a private
15	institution of higher education, including a private junior
16	college, that is located in this state under Section 51.212,
17	Education Code;
18	(2) a paid probation officer appointed by the director
19	of a community supervision and corrections department who has the
20	duties set out in Section 76.002 and the qualifications set out in
21	Section 76.005, or who was appointed in accordance with prior law;
22	(3) a parole officer employed by the Texas Department
23	of Criminal Justice who has the duties set out in Section 508.001
24	and the qualifications set out in Section 508.113 or in prior law;

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(4) a paid jailer;

3 auxiliary unit who regularly assists peace officers in enforcing
4 criminal laws;

5 (6) a member of the class of employees of the 6 correctional institutions division formally designated as 7 custodial personnel under Section 615.006 by the Texas Board of 8 Criminal Justice or its predecessor in function;

9 (7) a jailer or guard of a county jail who is appointed 10 by the sheriff and who:

11 (A) performs a security, custodial, or 12 supervisory function over the admittance, confinement, or 13 discharge of prisoners; and

14 (B) is certified by the Texas Commission on Law15 Enforcement;

16 (8) a juvenile correctional employee of the Texas17 Juvenile Justice Department;

18 (9) an employee of the Department of Aging and19 Disability Services or Department of State Health Services who:

20 (A) works at the department's maximum security21 unit; or

(B) performs on-site services for the Texas
 Department of Criminal Justice;

(10) an individual who is employed by the state or a
political or legal subdivision and is subject to certification by
the Texas Commission on Fire Protection;

No. 1526 1 political or legal subdivision whose principal duties are aircraft crash and rescue fire fighting; 2 3 (12)a member of an organized volunteer fire-fighting unit that: 4 5 (A) renders fire-fighting services without remuneration; and 6 7 (B) conducts a minimum of two drills each month, 8 each two hours long; (13) an individual who: 9 10 (A) performs emergency medical services or operates an ambulance; 11 is employed by a political subdivision of the 12 (B) state or is an emergency medical services volunteer as defined by 13 14 Section 773.003, Health and Safety Code; and 15 (C) is qualified as an emergency care attendant or at a higher level of training under Section 773.046, 773.047, 16 17 773.048, 773.049, or 773.0495, Health and Safety Code; (14)individual who is employed or 18 an formally designated as a chaplain for: 19 an organized volunteer fire-fighting unit or 20 (A) other fire department of this state or of a political subdivision of 21 22 this state; 23 (B) a law enforcement agency of this state or of a 24 political subdivision of this state; or 25 the Texas Department of Criminal Justice; (C) 26 (15) an individual who is employed by the state or a political subdivision of the state and who is considered by the 27

3 (16) an individual who is employed by the Department4 of Public Safety and, as certified by the director, is:

5 (A) deployed into the field in direct support of 6 a law enforcement operation, including patrol, investigative, 7 search and rescue, crime scene, on-site communications, or special 8 operations; and

9 (B) given a special assignment in direct support 10 of operations relating to organized crime, criminal interdiction, 11 border security, counterterrorism, intelligence, traffic 12 enforcement, emergency management, regulatory services, or special 13 investigations; or

14 (17) an individual who is employed by the Parks and
15 Wildlife Department and, as certified by the executive director of
16 the Parks and Wildlife Department, is:

(A) deployed into the field in direct support of
a law enforcement operation, including patrol, investigative,
search and rescue, crime scene, on-site communications, or special
operations; and

(B) given a special assignment in direct support of operations relating to organized crime, criminal interdiction, border security, counterterrorism, intelligence, traffic enforcement, emergency management, regulatory services, or special investigations.

26 SECTION 2. Sections 1551.114(e), (f), and (g), Insurance 27 Code, are amended to read as follows:

The state [An active employee described by Subsection 1 (e) (d) is not eligible to receive a state contribution under 2 Subchapter G for premiums. The community justice assistance 3 division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice] 4 is responsible for payment of the contributions for each of a 5 department's participating active employees and the employees' 6 dependents [that the state would make] under Subchapter G [if the 7 employees were state employees. Each covered active employee shall 8 pay that portion of the cost of group coverages selected by the 9 employee that exceeds the amount of division contributions]. 10

(f) A retired employee is eligible to participate in the 11 group benefits program on application to the board of trustees. On 12 application, a retired employee is automatically covered by the 13 basic coverage for annuitants unless the retired 14 employee 15 specifically waives coverage or unless the retired employee is expelled from the program. The state [A retired employee is not 16 17 eligible to receive a state contribution under Subchapter G for premiums. The community justice assistance division of the Texas 18 Department of Criminal Justice] is responsible for payment of the 19 contributions for each of a department's retired employees and the 20 retired employees' participating dependents [that the state would 21 make] under Subchapter G [if the retired employees were retired 22 state employees. Each participating retired employee shall pay that 23 24 portion of the cost of group coverage selected by the retired employee that exceeds the amount of division contributions]. The 25 26 retired employee shall pay contributions required from the retired employee in the manner prescribed by the board of trustees. Each 27

1 community supervision and corrections department shall notify each 2 of its retired employees of the eligibility for participation and 3 the costs associated with participation.

4 All contributions received under this section from the (q) [community justice assistance division of the Texas 5 state Department of Criminal Justice], active employees of community 6 supervision and corrections departments, and retired employees of 7 8 community supervision and corrections departments for basic, optional, and voluntary coverages under the group benefits program 9 10 shall be paid into the employees life, accident, and health insurance and benefits fund and shall be used by the board of 11 trustees to provide those coverages as provided by this chapter. 12

13 SECTION 3. Section 509.011(a-1), Government Code, and 14 Section 1551.322, Insurance Code, are repealed.

15 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act relating to death of peace officers employed by certain 16 the private 17 institutions of higher education located in this state applies only in relation to a death that occurs on or after the effective date of 18 19 this Act. Matters regarding eligibility, payment, and benefits under Chapter 615, Government Code, in relation to a death that 20 21 occurs before the effective date of this Act are governed by the law in effect when the death occurs, and the former law is continued in 22 23 effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
