H.B. No. 1551

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of a commission to review certain penal 3 laws of this state. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. COMMISSION TO STUDY CERTAIN PENAL LAWS. (a) А commission is created to study and review all penal laws of this 6 state other than criminal offenses: 7 (1) under the Penal Code; 8 9 (2) under Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code; or related to the operation of a motor vehicle. 10 (3) 11 (b) The commission shall: (1) evaluate all laws described by Subsection (a) of 12 this section; and 13 14 (2) make recommendations to the legislature regarding the repeal or amendment of laws that are identified as being 15 unnecessary, unclear, duplicative, overly broad, or otherwise 16 insufficient to serve the intended purpose of the law, including 17 the laws identified by the commission created by Section 29, 18 Chapter 1251 (H.B. 1396), Acts of the 84th Legislature, Regular 19 20 Session, 2015, as requiring additional review. 21 (c) The commission is composed of nine members appointed as 22 follows: 23 (1) two members appointed by the governor; 24 two members appointed by the lieutenant governor; (2)

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(3) two members appointed by the speaker of the house
 of representatives;

3 (4) two members appointed by the chief justice of the4 Supreme Court of Texas; and

5 (5) one member appointed by the presiding judge of the
6 Texas Court of Criminal Appeals.

7 (d) The officials making appointments to the commission 8 under Subsection (c) of this section shall ensure that the 9 membership of the commission includes representatives of all areas 10 of the criminal justice system, including prosecutors, defense 11 attorneys, judges, legal scholars, and relevant business 12 interests.

(e) The governor shall designate one member of thecommission to serve as the presiding officer of the commission.

15 (f) A member of the commission is not entitled to 16 compensation or reimbursement of expenses.

17 (g) The commission shall meet at the call of the presiding 18 officer.

Not later than November 1, 2018, the commission shall 19 (h) report the commission's findings and recommendations to the 20 governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of 21 representatives, the Supreme Court of Texas, the Texas Court of 22 Criminal Appeals, and the standing committees of the house of 23 24 representatives and the senate with primary jurisdiction over 25 justice. The commission shall include criminal in its 26 recommendations any specific statutes that the commission recommends repealing or amending. 27

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1 SECTION 2. APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS. Not later than the 60th 2 day after the effective date of this Act, the governor, the 3 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, 4 the chief justice of the Supreme Court of Texas, and the presiding 5 judge of the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals shall appoint the 6 members of the commission created under this Act.

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7 SECTION 3. ABOLITION OF COMMISSION. The commission is 8 abolished and this Act expires December 31, 2018.

9 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 10 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 11 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 12 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 13 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
