## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT	

- 2 relating to the prosecution and punishment of the smuggling of
- 3 persons.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 20.01, Penal Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Subdivisions (6), (7), and (8) to read as follows:
- 7 (6) "Agricultural land" has the meaning assigned by
- 8 Section 75.001, Civil Practice and Remedies Code.
- 9 (7) "Firearm" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 10 46.01.
- 11 (8) "Special investigator" includes an agent of the
- 12 United States Department of Homeland Security.
- SECTION 2. Sections 20.05(a) and (b), Penal Code, are
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) A person commits an offense if the person [, with the
- 16 intent to obtain a pecuniary benefit, knowingly:
- 17 (1) uses a motor vehicle, aircraft, watercraft, or
- 18 other means of conveyance to transport an individual with the
- 19 intent to:
- 20 (A) conceal the individual from a peace officer
- 21 or special investigator; or
- 22 (B) flee from a person the actor knows is a peace
- 23 officer or special investigator attempting to lawfully arrest or
- 24 detain the actor; or

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- 1 (2) assists, guides, or directs three or more
- 2 individuals to enter or remain on agricultural land without the
- 3 <u>effective consent of the owner</u> [encourages or induces a person to
- 4 enter or remain in this country in violation of federal law by
- 5 concealing, harboring, or shielding that person from detection].
- 6 (b) An offense under this section is a felony of the third 7 degree, except that the offense is:
- 8 (1) a felony of the second degree if:
- 9 (A) the actor commits the offense in a manner
- 10 that creates a substantial likelihood that the smuggled individual
- 11 will suffer serious bodily injury or death; [or]
- 12 (B) the smuggled individual is a child younger
- 13 than 18 years of age at the time of the offense;
- 14 (C) the offense was committed with the intent to
- 15 obtain a pecuniary benefit; or
- 16 (D) during the commission of the offense the
- 17 actor, another party to the offense, or an individual assisted,
- 18 guided, or directed by the actor knowingly possessed a firearm; or
- 19 (2) a felony of the first degree if:
- 20 (A) it is shown on the trial of the offense that,
- 21 as a direct result of the commission of the offense, the smuggled
- 22 individual became a victim of sexual assault, as defined by Section
- 23 22.011, or aggravated sexual assault, as defined by Section 22.021;
- 24 or
- 25 (B) the smuggled individual suffered serious
- 26 bodily injury or death.
- 27 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only

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- 1 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 2 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 3 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 4 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 5 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 6 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 7 before that date.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
