Sections 13.018(a) and (c), Parks and Wildlife 5 Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) The following people may apply to the department for a state parklands passport: 8 (1) a resident of this state who is 65 years old or 9 over who has resided in the state for six consecutive months 10 preceding the date of application for a parklands passport, a 11 12 member of the United States armed forces on active duty who is 65 years old or over, or any other individual in a category that the 13 14 commission by rule designates as a resident of this state who is 65 years old or over; 15 16 (2) a veteran or an active duty member of: the armed services of the United States; 17 (A) 18 (B) the Texas Army National Guard; (C) the Texas Air National Guard; or 19 (D) the Texas State Guard [who, as a result of 20 21 military service, has a service-connected disability, as defined by the Veterans' Administration, consisting of the loss of the use of a 22 lower extremity or of a 60 percent disability rating and who is 23 receiving compensation from the United States because of the 24

1 disability]; and

2 (3) an individual who has a physical or mental 3 impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life 4 activities of the individual.

(c) The holder of a state parklands passport issued on or 5 6 before August 31, 1995, a person whose birth date is before September 1, 1930, or a veteran or active duty member of the armed 7 8 services described by Subsection (a)(2) is entitled to enter any state park without payment of an entrance or admission fee. When a 9 fee is charged by the department for entrance of a vehicle into a 10 state park, the vehicle of the holder of a state parklands passport 11 is exempt from the fee when the holder is present. 12

13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
