A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to authorization by the Texas Higher Education
- 3 Coordinating Board for certain public junior colleges to offer
- 4 baccalaureate degree programs.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 130.0012, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsections (a), (b), (e), (g), and (h) and adding
- 8 Subsection (g-1) to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board may
- 10 [shall] authorize public junior colleges to offer baccalaureate
- 11 degree programs in the fields of applied science, [and] applied
- 12 technology, and nursing under this section. Offering a
- 13 baccalaureate degree program under this section does not otherwise
- 14 alter the role and mission of a public junior college.
- 15 (b) The coordinating board:
- 16 (1) shall authorize baccalaureate degree programs in
- 17 the fields of applied science and applied technology at each public
- 18 junior college that previously participated in a pilot project to
- 19 offer baccalaureate degree programs; and
- 20 (2) may authorize baccalaureate degree programs at one
- 21 or more public junior colleges that offer a degree program in the
- 22 field of nursing and have demonstrated a workforce need.
- (e) In determining what baccalaureate degree programs are
- 24 to be offered, the coordinating board shall:

- 1 (1) apply the same criteria and standards the coordinating board uses to approve baccalaureate degree programs at 2 general academic teaching institutions; and 3 4 (2) consider the following factors: 5 (A) $[\frac{1}{1}]$ the workforce need for the degree programs in the region served by the junior college; 6 7 (B) $[\frac{(2)}{(2)}]$ how degree programs those would 8 complement the other programs and course offerings of the junior college and whether the associate degree program offered by the 9 junior college in the same field has been successful; 10 (C) [(3)] whether those degree programs would 11 12 unnecessarily duplicate the degree programs offered by other institutions of higher education; [and] 13 14 (D) $[\frac{(4)}{(4)}]$ the ability of the junior college to 15 support the program with student enrollment and the adequacy of the junior college's facilities, faculty, administration, libraries, 16 17 and other resources; and (E) whether the junior college meets the taxable 18 19 property valuation amount established in Section 130.032. 20
- 20 (g) Except as provided by Subsection (g-1), in [In] its
 21 recommendations to the legislature relating to state funding for
 22 public junior colleges, the coordinating board shall recommend that
 23 a public junior college that previously participated in a pilot
 24 project to offer baccalaureate degree programs receive
 25 substantially the same state support for junior-level and
 26 senior-level courses in the field of applied science or applied
 27 technology offered under Subsection (b)(1) [this section] as that

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- 1 provided to a general academic teaching institution for substantially similar courses. In determining the contact hours 2 3 attributable to students enrolled in a junior-level or senior-level course offered under Subsection (b)(1) [this section] used to 4 5 determine a public junior college's proportionate share of state appropriations under Section 130.003, the coordinating board shall 6 weigh those contact hours as necessary to provide the junior 7 8 college the appropriate level of state support to the extent state funds for those courses are included in the appropriations. 9 10 subsection does not prohibit the legislature from directly appropriating state funds to support junior-level and senior-level 11 12 courses offered under <u>Subsection (b)(1)</u> [this section].
- 13 (g-1) A degree program created under Subsection (b)(2) may
 14 be funded solely by a public junior college's proportionate share
 15 of state appropriations under Section 130.003, local funds, and
 16 private sources. This subsection does not require the legislature
 17 to appropriate state funds to support a degree program created
 18 under Subsection (b)(2).
- 19 Each biennium, each [Each] public junior college offering a baccalaureate degree program under this section shall 20 conduct a review of each baccalaureate degree program offered and 21 prepare a [biennial] report on the operation, quality, and 22 23 effectiveness of those [the junior college's baccalaureate] degree 24 programs. A [and shall deliver a] copy of the report shall be delivered to the coordinating board in the form and at the time 25 26 determined by the coordinating board.
- 27 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
