- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
- 6 is amended by adding Section 32.0249 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 32.0249. MENTAL HEALTH SCREENINGS IN TEXAS HEALTH
- 8 STEPS PROGRAM. The executive commissioner, in the rules governing
- 9 the Texas Health Steps program, shall allow a provider to:
- 10 (1) conduct a mental health screening using one or
- 11 more validated, standardized mental health screening tools during
- 12 each annual medical exam of a recipient who is at least 12 years of
- 13 age but younger than 19 years of age; and
- 14 (2) be reimbursed for conducting one mental health
- 15 screening using one or more validated, standardized mental health
- 16 screening tools during each annual medical exam of a recipient
- 17 described by Subdivision (1).
- 18 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 19 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 20 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 21 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 22 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 23 waiver or authorization is granted.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
