- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 39.025, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Subsection (a-5) to read as follows:
- (a-5) A student enrolled in an eligible United States 8
- history dual credit course provided through an institution of 9
- higher education or a private or independent institution of higher 10
- education, as those terms are defined under Section 61.003, is 11
- eligible to be exempt from administration of the United States 12
- history end-of-course assessment instrument as prescribed by 13
- 14 Subsection (a). A student who fails to successfully complete the
- United States history dual credit course must take the United 15
- States history end-of-course assessment instrument. 16
- commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary for the administration 17
- of this subsection. 18
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2017-2018 19
- 20 school year.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 22
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2.4
