A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to evaluating the performance of public school districts
- 3 and campuses.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 39.053(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (c) School districts and campuses must be evaluated based on
- 8 five domains of indicators of achievement adopted under this
- 9 section that include:
- 10 (1) in the first domain, the results of:
- 11 (A) assessment instruments required under

- 13 assessment instruments required for graduation retaken by a
- 14 student, aggregated across grade levels by subject area, including:
- 15 (i) for the performance standard determined
- 16 by the commissioner under Section 39.0241(a), the percentage of
- 17 students who performed satisfactorily on the assessment
- 18 instruments, aggregated across grade levels by subject area; and
- 19 (ii) for the college readiness performance
- 20 standard as determined under Section 39.0241, the percentage of
- 21 students who performed satisfactorily on the assessment
- 22 instruments, aggregated across grade levels by subject area; and
- 23 (B) assessment instruments required under
- 24 Section 39.023(b), aggregated across grade levels by subject area,

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- 1 including the percentage of students who performed satisfactorily
- 2 on the assessment instruments, as determined by the performance
- 3 standard adopted by the agency, aggregated across grade levels by
- 4 subject area;
- 5 (2) in the second domain:
- 6 (A) for assessment instruments under Subdivision
- 7 (1)(A):
- 8 (i) for the performance standard determined
- 9 by the commissioner under Section 39.0241(a), the percentage of
- 10 students who met the standard for annual improvement on the
- 11 assessment instruments, as determined by the commissioner by rule
- 12 or by the method for measuring annual improvement under Section
- 13 39.034, aggregated across grade levels by subject area; and
- 14 (ii) for the college readiness performance
- 15 standard as determined under Section 39.0241, the percentage of
- 16 students who met the standard for annual improvement on the
- 17 assessment instruments, as determined by the commissioner by rule
- 18 or by the method for measuring annual improvement under Section
- 19 39.034, aggregated across grade levels by subject area; and
- 20 (B) for assessment instruments under Subdivision
- 21 (1)(B), the percentage of students who met the standard for annual
- 22 improvement on the assessment instruments, as determined by the
- 23 commissioner by rule or by the method for measuring annual
- 24 improvement under Section 39.034, aggregated across grade levels by
- 25 subject area;
- 26 (3) in the third domain, the student academic
- 27 achievement differentials among students from different racial and

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1 ethnic groups and socioeconomic backgrounds;
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- 2 (4) in the fourth domain:
- 3 (A) for evaluating the performance of high school
- 4 campuses and districts that include high school campuses:
- 5 (i) dropout rates, including dropout rates
- 6 and district completion rates for grade levels 9 through 12,
- 7 computed in accordance with standards and definitions adopted by
- 8 the National Center for Education Statistics of the United States
- 9 Department of Education;
- 10 (ii) high school graduation rates, computed
- 11 in accordance with standards and definitions adopted in compliance
- 12 with the Every Student Succeeds Act [No Child Left Behind Act of
- 13 2001] (20 U.S.C. Section 6301 et seq.);
- 14 (iii) the percentage of students who
- 15 successfully completed the curriculum requirements for the
- 16 distinguished level of achievement under the foundation high school
- 17 program;
- 18 (iv) the percentage of students who
- 19 successfully completed the curriculum requirements for an
- 20 endorsement under Section 28.025(c-1);
- 21 (v) the percentage of students who
- 22 completed a coherent sequence of career and technical courses;
- (vi) the percentage of students who satisfy
- 24 the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) college readiness benchmarks
- 25 prescribed by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board under
- 26 Section 51.3062(f) on an assessment instrument in reading, writing,

- 11 (B) community and parental involvement.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 39.054(a-1), Education Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (a-1) For purposes of assigning an overall performance
- 15 rating under Subsection (a), the commissioner shall attribute:
- 16 (1) 25 [55] percent of the performance evaluation to
- 17 the achievement indicators for the first, second, and third domains
- 18 under Sections 39.053(c)(1)-(3);
- 19 (2) for middle and junior high school and elementary
- 20 campuses and districts that include only those campuses:
- 21 (A) 10 percent of the performance evaluation to
- 22 the dropout rate indicator described by Section
- 23 39.053(c)(4)(B)(ii)(a); and
- 24 (B) [7] 35 percent to the remaining [of the
- 25 performance evaluation to the] applicable achievement indicators
- 26 for the fourth domain under Section 39.053(c)(4);
- 27 (3) for high school campuses and districts that

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(A) 10 percent of the performance evaluation to
the <u>dropout</u> [<u>high school graduation</u>] rate [<u>achievement</u>] indicator
described by Section 39.053(c)(4)(A)(i) [39.053(c)(4)(A)(ii)]; and

(B) 35 [25] percent to the remaining applicable
achievement indicators for the fourth domain under Section
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- 8 (4) for [10 percent of the performance evaluation to]
- 9 the locally [selected and] evaluated achievement indicators
- 10 provided for under the fifth domain under Section 39.053(c)(5):
- 11 (A) 15 percent of the performance evaluation to
- 12 the wellness and physical education indicator under Section
- 39.053(c)(5)(A); and

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- SECTION 3. Section 39.0546(a), Education Code, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 (a) For purposes of including the local evaluation of
- 20 districts and campuses under Section 39.053(c)(5) and assigning an
- 21 overall rating under Section 39.054, before the beginning of each
- 22 school year:
- 23 (1) each school district shall:
- (A) [select and] report to the agency the
- 25 following [three] programs or categories under Section
- 26 39.0545(b)(1)[, as added by Chapter 211 (H.B. 5), Acts of the 83rd
- 27 Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, under which the district will

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1 evaluate district performance \underline{\cdot}
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- 2 (i) wellness and physical education under
- 3 <u>Section 39.0545(b)(1)(B); and</u>
- 4 (ii) community and parental involvement
- 5 under Section 39.0545(b)(1)(C);
- 6 (B) submit to the agency the criteria the
- 7 district will use to evaluate district performance and assign the
- 8 district a performance rating; and
- 9 (C) make the information described by Paragraphs
- 10 (A) and (B) available on the district's Internet website; and
- 11 (2) each campus shall:
- (A) [select and] report to the agency the [three]
- 13 programs or categories described by Subdivision (1)(A) [under
- 14 Section 39.0545(b)(1), as added by Chapter 211 (H.B. 5), Acts of the
- 15 83rd Legislature, Regular Session, 2013, under which the campus
- 16 will evaluate campus performance;
- 17 (B) submit to the agency the criteria the campus
- 18 will use to evaluate campus performance and assign the campus a
- 19 performance rating; and
- 20 (C) make the information described by Paragraphs
- 21 (A) and (B) available on the Internet website of the campus.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2017-2018
- 23 school year.
- 24 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
