## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 533, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 533.00293 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 533.00293. INFORMATION SHARING. (a) In this section:
8	(1) "Care coordination" means assisting recipients to
9	develop a plan of care, including a service plan, that meets the
10	recipient's needs and coordinating the provision of Medicaid
11	benefits in a manner that is consistent with the plan of care. The
12	term is synonymous with "case management," "service coordination,"
13	and "service management."
14	(2) "Care coordinator" means a person, including a
15	case manager, engaged by a Medicaid managed care organization to
16	<pre>provide care coordination benefits.</pre>
17	(b) To the extent permitted under applicable federal and
18	state law enacted to protect the confidentiality and privacy of
19	patients' health information, managed care organizations under
20	contract with the commission to provide health care services to
21	recipients shall ensure the sharing of information, including
22	recipient medical records, among care coordinators and health care
23	providers as appropriate to provide care coordination benefits.
24	For purposes of implementing this section, a managed care

- 1 organization may allow a care coordinator to share a recipient's
- 2 service plan with health care providers, subject to the limitations
- 3 of this section.
- 4 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 5 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 6 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 7 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 8 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 9 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
