classified as a curio or relic by the United States Department of 1 2 Justice or the actor otherwise possesses, manufactures, transports, repairs, or sells the firearm silencer in compliance 3 4 with federal law. SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 5 6 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 7 8 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 9 For purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the 10 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred 11

12 before that date.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
