A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to authorization by the Texas Higher Education
- 3 Coordinating Board for certain public junior colleges to offer
- 4 baccalaureate degree programs.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 130.0012, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsections (a), (b), (e), (g), and (h) and adding
- 8 Subsection (g-1) to read as follows:
- 9 (a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board may
- 10 [shall] authorize public junior colleges to offer baccalaureate
- 11 degree programs in the fields of applied science, [and] applied
- 12 technology, and nursing under this section. Offering a
- 13 baccalaureate degree program under this section does not otherwise
- 14 alter the role and mission of a public junior college.
- 15 (b) The coordinating board:
- 16 (1) shall authorize baccalaureate degree programs in
- 17 the fields of applied science and applied technology at each public
- 18 junior college that previously participated in a pilot project to
- 19 offer baccalaureate degree programs; and
- 20 (2) may authorize a baccalaureate degree program at a
- 21 public junior college primarily located in a municipality where a
- 22 medical school is located and with a population of 750,000 or more
- 23 that is primarily located in a county with a population of 1.5
- 24 million or less that offers a degree program in the field of nursing

- 1 and has demonstrated a workforce need.
- 2 (e) In determining what baccalaureate degree programs are
- 3 to be offered, the coordinating board shall:
- 4 (1) apply the same criteria and standards the
- 5 coordinating board uses to approve baccalaureate degree programs at
- 6 general academic teaching institutions; and
- 7 (2) consider the following factors:
- 8 (A) (A) (A) the workforce need for the degree
- 9 programs in the region served by the junior college;
- 10 $\underline{\text{(B)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(2)}}{\text{)}}$] how those degree programs would
- 11 complement the other programs and course offerings of the junior
- 12 college and whether the associate degree program offered by the
- 13 junior college in the same field has been successful;
- (C) $\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$ whether those degree programs would
- 15 unnecessarily duplicate the degree programs offered by other
- 16 institutions of higher education; [and]
- (D) $\left[\frac{4}{4}\right]$ the ability of the junior college to
- 18 support the program with student enrollment and the adequacy of the
- 19 junior college's facilities, faculty, administration, libraries,
- 20 and other resources; and
- 21 <u>(E) whether the junior college meets the taxable</u>
- 22 property valuation amount established in Section 130.032.
- 23 (g) Except as provided by Subsection (g-1), in $[\frac{1}{2}]$ its
- 24 recommendations to the legislature relating to state funding for
- 25 public junior colleges, the coordinating board shall recommend that
- 26 a public junior college that previously participated in a pilot
- 27 project to offer baccalaureate degree programs receive

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1 substantially the same state support for junior-level and senior-level courses in the field of applied science or applied 2 technology offered under <u>Subsection (b)(1)</u> [this section] as that 3 provided to a general academic teaching institution 4 substantially similar courses. In determining the contact hours 5 attributable to students enrolled in a junior-level or senior-level 6 course offered under Subsection (b)(1) [this section] used to 7 8 determine a public junior college's proportionate share of state appropriations under Section 130.003, the coordinating board shall 9 10 weigh those contact hours as necessary to provide the junior college the appropriate level of state support to the extent state 11 12 funds for those courses are included in the appropriations. This subsection does not prohibit the legislature from directly 13 appropriating state funds to support junior-level and senior-level 14 15 courses offered under <u>Subsection (b)(1)</u> [this section].

- 16 (g-1) A degree program created under Subsection (b)(2) may
 17 be funded solely by a public junior college's proportionate share
 18 of state appropriations under Section 130.003, local funds, and
 19 private sources. This subsection does not require the legislature
 20 to appropriate state funds to support a degree program created
 21 under Subsection (b)(2).
- (h) <u>Each biennium</u>, <u>each</u> [<u>Each</u>] public junior college offering a baccalaureate degree program under this section shall conduct a review of each baccalaureate degree program offered and prepare a [<u>biennial</u>] report on the operation, <u>quality</u>, and effectiveness of <u>those</u> [<u>the junior college's baccalaureate</u>] degree programs. A [<u>and shall deliver a</u>] copy of the report shall be

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- 1 <u>delivered</u> to the coordinating board in the form and at the time
- 2 determined by the coordinating board.
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
