## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the authority of counties to require a person to notify
3	a local governmental entity before starting an outdoor fire;
4	creating a criminal penalty.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 352, Local Government
7	Code, is amended by adding Section 352.083 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 352.083. NOTIFICATION OF OUTDOOR BURNING. (a) This
9	section does not apply to a person who obtains a permit for outdoor
10	burning before starting an outdoor fire in the county from a local
11	governmental entity with authority to provide fire protection
12	services in the area. A local governmental entity that issues a
13	permit described by this subsection must notify the local
14	governmental entity described by Subsection (b) that the permit was
15	<u>issued.</u>
16	(b) The commissioners court of a county by order may require
17	a person to notify a local governmental entity, as specified by the
18	commissioners court, before starting an outdoor fire in the county.
19	This subsection does not authorize a commissioners court to require
20	a person to take any action other than to provide a single notice to
21	the appropriate local governmental entity. In this section,
22	<pre>"outdoor fire" does not include:</pre>
23	(1) a campfire started at a campsite;
24	(2) a fire used to cook food on a grill or in a pit;

- 1 (3) a fire started in an enclosed outdoor fireplace or 2 oven, including a chimenea; or
- 3 (4) a fire used to burn trash in an enclosed container.
- 4 (c) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly or
- 5 <u>intentionally violates an order adopted under Subsection (a). An</u>
- 6 offense under this subsection is a Class C misdemeanor.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
