1-19 relating to the confidentiality of certain information related to a 1-20 computer security incident. 1-21

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 1-23 SECTION 1. Section 552.139, Government Code, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (b-1) and (d) to read as follows: 1-24

(b)

The following information is confidential:

(1)a computer network vulnerability report;

1-27 1-28 (2) any other assessment of the extent to which data processing operations, a computer, a computer program, network, system, or system interface, or software of a governmental body or 1-29 1-30 a contractor of a governmental body is vulnerable of to unauthorized access or harm, including an assessment of the extent 1-31 to which the governmental body's or contractor's electronically stored information containing sensitive or critical information is 1-32 1-33 1-34 vulnerable to alteration, damage, erasure, or inappropriate use; 1-35 [and]

1-36 a photocopy or other copy of an identification (3) 1-37 badge issued to an official or employee of a governmental body; and 1-38 (4) information directly arising from a governmental

body's routine efforts to prevent, detect, investigate, or mitigate 1-39 a computer security incident, including information contained in or 1-40 1-41

(d) A state agency shall redact from a contract posted on 1-45 the agency's Internet website under Section 2261.253 information that is made confidential by, or excepted from required public disclosure under, this section. The redaction of information under 1-46 1-47 1-48 1-49 this subsection does not exempt the information from the requirements of Section 552.021 or 552.221. 1-50

SECTION 2. Sections 552.139(b)(4) and (b-1), Government Code, as added by this Act, apply only to a request for public 1-51 1-52 1-53 information received on or after the effective date of this Act. A 1-54 request received before the effective date of this Act is governed 1-55 by the law in effect when the request was received, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 1-56

1-57 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 1-58 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-59 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-60 1-61 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
