A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to training for employees of school districts and 3 open-enrollment charter schools on the prevention of sexual abuse 4 and other maltreatment of certain children.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 38.0041(c), Education Code, is amended 7 to read as follows:

(c) The methods under Subsection (b)(1) for increasing 8 9 awareness of issues regarding sexual abuse and other maltreatment of children must include training, as provided by this subsection, 10 11 concerning prevention techniques for and recognition of sexual 12 abuse and all other maltreatment of children, including the sexual abuse and other maltreatment of children with significant cognitive 13 14 disabilities in both educational and noneducational settings. The training: 15

16 (1) must be provided, as part of a new employee 17 orientation, to all new school district and open-enrollment charter 18 school employees and to existing district and open-enrollment 19 charter school employees on a schedule adopted by the agency by rule 20 until all district and open-enrollment charter school employees 21 have taken the training; and

(2) must include training concerning:
(A) factors indicating a child is at risk for
sexual abuse or other maltreatment;

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H.B. No. 1869 (B) likely warning signs indicating a child may be a victim of sexual abuse or other maltreatment; (C) internal procedures for seeking assistance for a child who is at risk for sexual abuse or other maltreatment,

5 including referral to a school counselor, a social worker, or 6 another mental health professional;

7 (D) techniques for reducing a child's risk of 8 sexual abuse or other maltreatment; and

9 (E) community organizations that have relevant 10 existing research-based programs that are able to provide training 11 or other education for school district or open-enrollment charter 12 school staff members, students, and parents.

13 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2017-2018 14 school year.

15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
