## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to a penalty for independent executors who misrepresent in

3 an affidavit in lieu of the inventory, appraisement, and list of

4 claims that certain beneficiaries received the inventory and

- 5 appraisement.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 309, Estates Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 309.0575 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 309.0575. PENALTY FOR MISREPRESENTATION IN AFFIDAVIT
- 10 IN LIEU OF INVENTORY, APPRAISEMENT, AND LIST OF CLAIMS. (a) The
- 11 court, on its own motion or on motion of any person interested in
- 12 the estate, and after an independent executor has been cited to
- 13 answer at a time and place fixed in the notice, may fine an
- 14 independent executor in an amount not to exceed \$1,000 if the court
- 15 finds that the executor misrepresented in an affidavit in lieu of
- 16 the inventory, appraisement, and list of claims filed by the
- 17 executor that all beneficiaries, other than those described by
- 18 Section 309.056(b-1), received a verified, full, and detailed
- inventory and appraisement as required by Section 309.056(b).
- 20 (b) The independent executor and the executor's sureties,
- 21 if any, are liable for any fine imposed under this section and for
- 22 <u>all damages</u> and costs sustained by the executor's
- 23 misrepresentation. The fine, damages, and costs may be recovered
- 24 in any court of competent jurisdiction.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 309.0575, Estates Code, as added by this
- 2 Act, applies only to the estate of a decedent who dies on or after
- 3 the effective date of this Act. The estate of a decedent who dies
- 4 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 5 effect on the date of the decedent's death, and the former law is
- 6 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
